- Requests from the Land Use/Sustainability/Resilience Committee for the Ad-Hoc Committee to Explore:
 - Research ways of providing advanced notice to area residents when trees are being removed.
 - Research ways of planting new trees before trees are removed to help maintain continuity of the urban forest in neighborhoods
