- 2. \$3 million 2018 Urban Greening Grant
- 3. \$1 million FY 2023 U.S. Congressional Workforce Grant via UCR OASIS Partnership






PARTNERSHIPS

- 1. Community Garden: \$32,000 donation from Love Tito's Foundation
- 2. Programming: Riverside Food Systems Alliance, UC Riverside, UC Cooperative Extension, Growing Hope Project, Riverside-Corona Resource Conservation District, industry, others
- 3. Land: California Natural Resources Agency Covenant Agreement
- 4. Workforce Development: received \$1 million U.S. Congressional Earmark; pending application to California Workforce Development Board's High Roads Training Partnership Resilient Workforce Fund (\$4 million)
- 5. Facilities: Receipt of an unsolicited land lease and lease back offer from Northside Solar Farm, LLC to construct solar greenhouses, structures, and agrivoltaic facilities with a market value of over \$4 million
- 6. Community: "Everything everywhere all at once" support


NORTHSIDE SOLAR FARM, LLC LEASE/LEASE BACK AGREEMENT

- 1. State-of-the-art solar greenhouses, agrivoltaics and solar structures generating approx. 750 kHw of renewable energy fully financed and constructed by Northside Solar Farm, LLC at no cost to City or project partners.
- 2. Lease Terms: 2-year option for \$500; initial lease term of 20 years with an annual rent of \$100.
- 3. \$1 annual lease back benefits for the City
 - a. Approx. 55,000 sq ft of solar greenhouses and structures, and 12,000 sq feet of agrivoltaics for climate smart, regenerative and high-tech agriculture workforce development and education programs
 - b. Onsite jobs and workforce training: 135+ individuals annually
 - c. 6-10 beginning farmers and ag tech businesses incubated annually a. Est. 15-20 jobs from incubation
 - b. Est. 25 companies launched over 10 years

RECOMMENDATIONS

That the City Council:

- 1. Receive and file an update on the Northside Agriculture Innovation Center;
- Approve a Lease/Lease-Back Agreement with Northside Solar Farm, LLC for a two (2) year option period for a sum of five hundred dollars (\$500), and a primary lease term of twenty years with an annual rent of one hundred dollars (\$100) for a total lease agreement of \$2,500;
- 3. Authorize the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the Lease/Lease-Back Agreement with Northside Solar Farm, LLC, including making minor and non-substantive changes; and
- 4. Direct staff to draft a Professional Services Agreement with Northside Solar Farm, LLC to complete the Northside Agriculture Innovation Center's master site designs and return to City Council for its review and approval.
