Dear Ms. Hill,

Your application requesting a vehicle for hire permit was received by Detectives in the Riverside Police Department's Vice Unit on March 8th, 2023. Detectives conducted a background investigation regarding your application, specifically with respect to your DUI arrest back in 2015. Records indicate you were charged with 23152(a), 23152(b), and 12500(a) of the California Vehicle Code (CVC). Although the charges of 23152(a) CVC and 12500(a) CVC were dismissed in the furtherance of justice, you were convicted of 23152(b) CVC and sentenced to probation for a period of 36 months. Because of this, your application requesting a vehicle for hire permit has been denied.

Section 5.40.180(D)(1) of the Riverside Municipal Code states the following;

The Chief of Police may deny or revoke the issuance of a driver's permit under any of the following circumstances:

1. The applicant or driver's permit holder has been convicted of reckless driving or of driving a vehicle while under the influence of any alcoholic beverage or drug, or under the combined influence of any alcoholic beverage or drug.

Please be advised that a notice of appeal may be filed with the City of Riverside by depositing said notice with the City Clerk within fifteen (15) days after notice of denial of the application as provided for under section 5.40.185 of the Riverside Municipal Code. The code requires that you set forth in writing the grounds for the appeal.
