

1 RESOLUTION NO.

2 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIVERSIDE,
3 CALIFORNIA, DECLARING ITS INTENTION TO LEVY AND COLLECT
4 ASSESSMENTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023-2024 WITHIN STREET LIGHTING
5 DISTRICT NO. 1, APPROVING REPORT, AND GIVING NOTICE OF THE
6 TIME AND PLACE OF A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED
7 ASSESSMENTS.

8 WHEREAS, the City Council (“City Council”) of the City of Riverside, California (“City”),
9 has established Street Lighting District No. 1 (“District”) pursuant to the Landscaping and Lighting
10 Act of 1972, Part 2 (commencing with § 22500) Division 15 of the Streets and Highways Code; and

11 WHEREAS, on February 7, 2023, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 23952, which
12 initiated proceedings to levy and collect assessments for fiscal year 2023-2024 within the District and
13 ordered the preparation of an engineer’s report regarding the assessments proposed to be levied and
14 collected within the District to pay the costs of improvements and the maintenance and servicing of
15 public lighting facilities in the City for fiscal year 2023-2024; and

16 WHEREAS, in accordance with Resolution No. 23952, Webb Municipal Finance, LLC, has
17 prepared and filed an engineer’s report (“Report”) with the City Clerk regarding the assessments to be
18 levied and collected within the District for fiscal year 2023-2024 to pay for the costs of improvements
19 and the maintenance and servicing of public lighting facilities, and the Report has been presented to
20 and considered by the City Council; and

21 WHEREAS, it is necessary that the City Council adopt a resolution of intention pursuant to
22 section 22624 of the Streets and Highways Code, among other things, fixing and giving notice of the
23 time and place of a public hearing on said report and the proposed assessments for said fiscal year.

24 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Riverside,
25 California, as follows:

26 Section 1: Findings. The City Council finds that:

- 27 (a) The foregoing recitals are true and correct;
- 28 (b) The Report contains all matters required by sections 22565 through 22574 of
the Streets and Highways Code and may, therefore, be approved by the City Council; and
- (c) There are no new improvements, nor any substantial changes in existing

1 improvements, being proposed.

2 Section 2: Intention. The City Council declares that it intends to levy assessments on all lots
3 and parcels of assessable land within the District for fiscal year 2023-2024, as set forth in the Report.
4 Those assessments will be collected at the same time and in the same manner as county taxes are
5 collected, and all laws providing for the collection and enforcement of county taxes shall apply to the
6 collection and enforcement of the assessments.

7 Section 3: Improvements. The improvements authorized for the District are:

8 (a) The installation or construction of public lighting facilities;

9 (b) The installation or construction of any facilities which are appurtenant to such
10 public lighting facilities or which are necessary or convenient for the maintenance or servicing thereof,
11 including grading, clearing, removal of debris, and the installation or construction of curbs, gutters,
12 walls, sidewalks, paving, or electrical facilities; and

13 (c) The maintenance and servicing of such public lighting facilities in the City.

14 Section 4: Assessment District. The distinctive designation of the District is “Street Lighting
15 District No. 1.” Said assessment district includes all of the territory within the corporate limits of the
16 City and the boundaries thereof are coterminous with such corporate limits.

17 Section 5: Report. The Report, which is on file with the City Clerk and which has been
18 presented to the City Council at the meeting at which this resolution is adopted, is hereby approved.
19 Reference is made to the Report for a full and detailed description of the improvements, the boundaries
20 of the District, and any zones therein, and the proposed assessments upon assessable lots and parcels
21 of land therein for fiscal year 2023-2024.

22 Section 6: Hearing. The time and place of the public hearing required by sections 22624
23 through 22629 of the Streets and Highways Code is set for 3:00 p.m. on June 27, 2023, in the Art Pick
24 Council Chamber of the City of Riverside at 3900 Main Street in the City of Riverside. A virtual
25 meeting may be held and viewed at www.engageriverside.com. The agenda for the meeting will be
26 published on June 15, 2023, and will indicate if the hearing is virtual or in-person. A copy of the
27 agenda will be available at www.engageriverside.com or may be requested from the City Clerk’s
28 Office at City_Clerk@riversideca.gov.

1 Section 7: Notice of Hearing. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that at 3:00 p.m., on June 27,
2 2023, the City Council will hold an in-person and/or virtual public hearing with regard to the
3 assessments to be levied on assessable lots and parcels in the District for fiscal year 2023-2024 as set
4 forth in the Report on file with the City Clerk.

5 Any interested person may file a written protest with the City Clerk prior to the conclusion of
6 the hearing, which protest must state all grounds of objection and describe the property within the
7 District owned by any such person. Mail written statements to City Clerk, City Hall, 3900 Main Street,
8 Riverside, CA 92522, or email City_Clerk@riversideca.gov. eComments can be submitted until two
9 hours before the meeting at www.engageriverside.com. Interested persons will be afforded the
10 opportunity to speak and be heard at 3:00 p.m. on June 27, 2023, by calling 951-826-8600 and/or
11 appearing in-person at the public hearing at the Art Pick Council Chamber at 3900 Main Street,
12 Riverside, CA.

13 Section 8: Publication. The City Clerk shall cause a copy of this Resolution to be published
14 once, at least ten (10) days prior to the date of the hearing, in The Press-Enterprise as required by
15 section 6061 of the Government Code and sections 22552 and 22553 of the Streets and Highway Code.

16 Section 9: Assessment Amount. The annual assessment will not increase from the previous
17 year.

18 Section 10: Designated Person. The City Council designates the Chief Financial Officer,
19 telephone number (951) 826-5454, as the person to answer inquiries regarding the levying and
20 collection of assessments in the District for fiscal year 2023-2024.
