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BACKGROUND

- On March 11, 2021, President Biden signed into law the American Rescue Plan Act
- On November 9, 2021, the City Council approved the first Expenditure Plan-\$36,767,594
- The City received two installments of \$36,767,594 each in June 2021 and 2022 for a total amount of \$73,535,189
- On February 7, 2023, the City Council approved the second Expenditure Plan - \$36,767,594 and reallocations
 - Additional \$5 million for Parks Maintenance Projects & Bordwell Gymnasium
 - Additional \$588,797 for Affordable Housing funding
- Now: Staff review of spending status to date, reassessment of needs

CITYWIDE REVENUE LOSS

- Allocate residual balance of \$2,193,244
- Help offset immediate impact of Water GFT loss to General Fund,
 ~\$8.5 million annually
 - September 19, 2023: Council approved placing future annual Water GFT collections in escrow fund until pending litigation resolved
- Helps City to meet ARPA requirement to utilize or encumber ARPA funds no later than December 2024.

- \$1,800,000 El Dorado Park Improvements
- Staff instructed to return with itemized list of infrastructure needs.

- Itemized Parks projects list totaling \$12,028,000
- \$10,000,000 allocation approved
- Additional \$3,000,000 for Bordwell Gymnasium Project

Additional Funding Request \$3,000,000

- Playground Equipment \$1,200,000
- Fairmount Park Lake Dredging \$1,000,000
- Fairmount Golf Course Fence Replacement \$800,000

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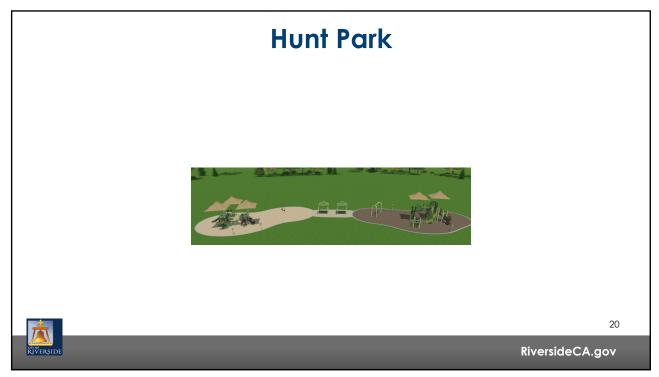


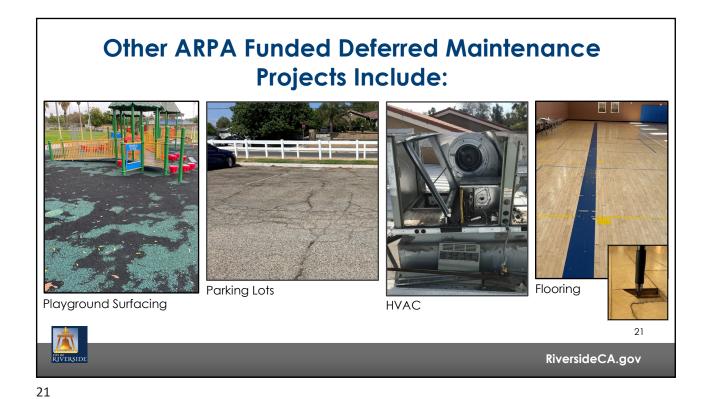








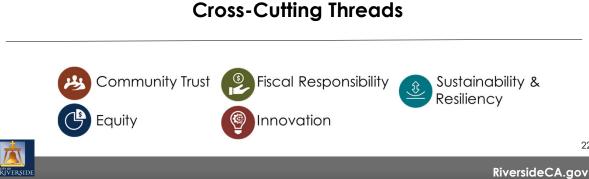




STRATEGIC PLAN ALIGNMENT

RECOMMENDATIONS

That the City Council:

- 1. Receive an update on the American Rescue Plan Act Expenditure Plan;
- 2. With at least five affirmative votes, authorize the Chief Financial Officer, or designee, to record the reallocation of funds from various American Rescue Plan Act Expenditure Plan Projects to the Citywide Park Improvement Program in the amount of \$3,000,000;
- 3. With at least five affirmative votes, authorize the Chief Financial Officer, or designee, to record the reallocation of funds from various American Rescue Plan Act Expenditure Plan Projects to General Fund revenue replacement in the amount of \$2,193,244;



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RECOMMENDATIONS

- 4. Reaffirm City Manager, or designee, flexibility to reallocate funds from the proposed Expenditure Plan to other similar and eligible uses should feasibility or timeliness concerns arise; and
- Authorize the City Manager, or designee, to negotiate and execute all agreements, contracts and documents related to the approved reallocations in the Expenditure Plan for the American Rescue Plan Act funding, including making minor non-substantive changes.



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
