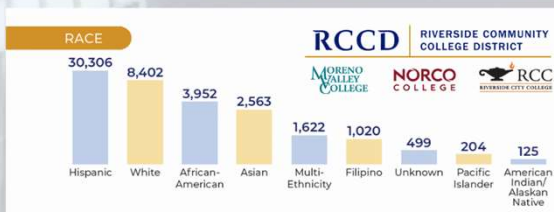

### Amazon Adds MVC to its Career Choice Program

Moreno Valley College was one of 40 higher education institutions added to Amazon's Career Choice program. This addition of institutions brings the total number of approved colleges to 180 in 14 countries that can provide educational services to Amazon employees. In California 10 higher education institutions are approved providers of services. Of the 10, seven are community colleges. In the fall of 2021, Amazon invested \$1.2 billion in its hourly workforce. A portion of the monies included tuition funding opportunities for nearly a million workers.

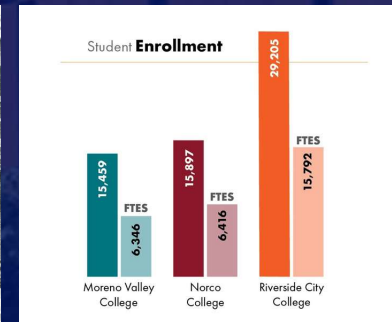
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Riverside City College Campus continues to age, and enrollment increases throughout the District at each of our Colleges.

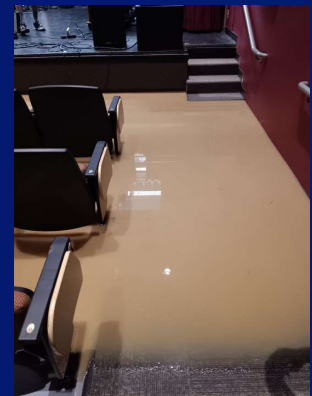


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## Basic Repairs and Updates Needed
