# **BACKGROUND**

- Public demonstrations and rallies conducted in California cities and college campuses nationwide have erupted in violence
- Individuals and groups have used improvised weapons to inflict injury on members of the public attending these events and law enforcement personnel present
- Various improvised items have been used, including but not limited to wood and metal pipes, poles, bats, chains, projectiles, glass bottles and containers filled with flammable or noxious substances, and aerosol sprays
- Some subversive groups use social media platforms to instruct bad actors on tactics to inflict terror. Instructions have included the wearing of masks and face coverings during these events.

# FIGHT WITH TOOLS




## Obscure their senses. Maintain creativity. Play dirty.

Never bring a tool you aren't prepared to use. Some tools come with duties. If you aren't prepared to fill that role, pass it to someone who will. Don't be afraid to turn down any risk you aren't prepared to accept!

Your senses are site, taste, touch, hearing and smell. Police use alarms, lights and tear gas to obstruct these senses and cause panic. Don't panic. They are limited by the same serv you are. Utilize this weakness and join in on the fun Flash lights, road flares and fire works go a long way.

Pepperspray, bear mace and fire extinguishers are great tools for keeping enemy combatants at a safe and healthy distance.

# **NEED FOR MUNICIPAL CODE**

- It is imperative that individuals be able to engage in peaceful expressive public activity without fear of violence and injury.
- It is also important that members of the public and law enforcement encountering these events are able to due so without fear of suffering injury.
- The proposed regulations are necessary in order to protect the public health, safety and welfare.
- The content-neutral time, place, and manager restrictions allow for peaceful public expressive activity and address the City's interest in public safety

# SIMILAR RESTRICTIONS IN OTHER JURISDICTIONS

- Cal State and UC systems Instituted policy that face coverings; masks and other attempts to conceal one's identity are not allowed "with the intent of intimidating and harassing any person or group, or for the purpose of evading or escaping discovery, recognition, or identification in the commission of violations"
- Cities of Berkeley, Laguna Beach, Los Angeles, Modesto, Oakland, Santa Monica, and others have put in place ordinances prohibiting, or authorizing the issuance of regulations prohibiting, the carrying at protests, public assemblies, and community events of items that can readily be used as weapons
- Nassau County, New York The Mask Transparency Act, signed into law makes it a misdemeanor for anyone to wear a facial covering to hide their identity in public.
- Charlottesville, Virginia adopted similar ordinances as a result of an afteraction report recommendation.

# RIVERSIDE MUNICIPAL CODE

- Section 9.53 Prohibition Carrying or possessing specified items while attending or participating in any public demonstration, gathering, rally, protest, picket line or public assembly
  - Will limit items such as but not limited to wooden sticks, metal and plastic pipes, baseball bats, aerosol sprays, weapons, glass bottles, metal containers, shields, gas masks, helmets, body armor, bricks and rocks that can and have been weaponized at protests, public assemblies, and community events, while still allowing for peaceful expressive activity.
  - Face coverings and other disguises would also be prohibited, except for coverings worn due to religious beliefs, practices or observances or due to medical necessity.
