7	Section 1: Section 6.15.020, Declaration of Nuisances, of the Riverside Municipal Code
8	is hereby amended in part as follows:
9	"Section 6.15.020 Declaration of Nuisances.

11	I. The outdoor storage of personal property on public property as follows:
12	1. The use of public property to store, maintain, place or abandon any personal
13	property, which includes but is not limited to, camp paraphernalia such as
14	tarpaulins, cots, beds, sleeping bags, hammocks, tents, huts, or similar personal
15	property, on any public street, on any public sidewalk, any parking lot or public
16	area, improved or unimproved, any public park, parkway, median or greenbelt, except
17	as otherwise provided.

	Section 2: Chapter 9.04, Offenses, Table of Contents, of the Riverside Municipal Code is
19	hereby amended in part as follows:
20	"Chapter 9.04
21	OFFENSES
22	Sections:
23	9.04.010 Prohibition against certain forms of aggressive solicitation.

26	9.04.600 <u>Camping on public sidewalks, streets, and property.</u> "
27	Section 3: Section 9.04.600, Camping on public sidewalks, streets, and property, is hereby

 $_{28} \parallel$ added to the Riverside Municipal Code as follows:

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2	"Section 9.04.600 Camping on public sidewalks, streets, and/or property.
_	A. The purpose of this section is to protect and maintain the health,
3	safety, and welfare of the City so that the public streets and areas within the City
4	of Riverside should be readily accessible, available, and safe for residents and
'	the public at large. The use of these areas for camping purposes interferes with
5	the rights of others to use the areas for the purposes for which they were
_	intended. The purpose of this Section is to maintain public streets and areas
6	within the City of Riverside in a safe, clean, and accessible condition."
7	B. The terms used herein are defined as follows:
′	1. "Camp" includes, but is not limited to, to pitch, erect, maintain, or
8	occupy camp facilities, to live outdoors, or use of camp paraphernalia on public
	streets, sidewalks, or property.
9	2. "Camping" includes, but is not limited to, use of use of public streets
10	or property for living accommodations or habitation purposes such as sleeping,
10	laying down bedding, storing personal property, etc.
11	3. "Camp Paraphernalia" includes, but is not limited to, tarpaulins, cots,
	beds, sleeping bags, hammocks, tents, etc.
12	4. "Camp Facilities" includes, but is not limited to, tents, huts, temporary
10	shelters, or similar equipment.
13	C. Unless otherwise permitted by law or permit, it is unlawful for any
14	person to camp, use camp facilities, or use camp paraphernalia in or on any
1.	public park, street, sidewalk, or other public property."
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16	Section 4: Section 13.04.010, Loitering so as to obstruct, of the Riverside Municipal
17	Code is amended in part as follows.

18	"Section 13.04.010 Loitering so as to obstruct.
	It is unlawful for any person to camp, loiter, stand, or sit in or upon any
19	public street, alley, sidewalk or crosswalk so as to in any manner hinder or obstruct
20	the free passage therein or thereon of persons or vehicles passing or attempting to
20	pass along the same."
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22	Section 5: The City Council has reviewed the matter and, based upon the facts and
22	information contained in the staff reports, administrative record, and written and oral testimony,
23	information contained in the start reports, administrative record, and written and oral testimony,
24	hereby finds that this ordinance is not subject to CEQA pursuant to Sections 15060(c)(2),
- '	, and the second of the second

nd, based upon the facts and vritten and oral testimony, ant to Sections 15060(c)(2), 15060(c)(3) and/or 15061(b)(3) of the State CEQA Guidelines, California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Chapter 3, in that it will not result in a direct or reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment nor have a significant impact on the environment.
