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Background

- Water Production and Conveyance Agreement with Western Municipal Water District
 - Approved by Board in 2008
 - Approved by Council, March 30, 2009
 - Authorizes use of underutilized system capacity
 - Built for peak capacity
 - Production/conveyance available off-peak



Background

- WMWD secures own rights
 - 4,208 from EVMWD (Meeks and Daley)
 - 1,500 from Riverside Highland Water Company
- RPU produces/conveys WMWD's water
 - Recovers energy costs
 - Charges average Operation and Maintenance cost



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Background

- Policy Principles for Water Portfolio Management
 - Approved by City Council October 2014

Riverside will strive to appropriately monetize unused and potentially expiring local water production and export rights through pre-planned and pre-executed water sales agreements.



First Amendment

- RPU has underutilized Bunker Hill Basin Rights
 - Drought response
 - Down 5,000 out of 55,000 AF
 - Essentially use or lose water rights




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Benefits

- RPU's revenues increase
 - Net about \$1.3 M
 - Estimated \$2.0 M loss for first 2 months of FY 16
- WMWD has access to lower cost source
 - Save about \$0.4 M versus imported water









Typical Wheeling Costs (\$/AF) Leased Water Cost \$188 Average Production Cost (Typical) \$40 Average O&M Cost for the System \$350 Weighted Energy Cost \$85 Weighted Unit Cost \$664

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Recommendations

Recommend that the Board of Public Utilities recommend that the City Council:

- 1. Approve the First Amendment to the 2009 Water Production and Conveyance Agreement with Water Municipal Water District of Riverside County; and
- 2. Authorize the City Manager or designee to execute the agreement.
