SUBJECT: ACCEPTANCE OF A DONATION FROM KLEINFELDER FOR URBAN SEARCH AND RESCUE PROGRAM – SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION FOR \$320

ISSUE:

Acceptance of a \$320 donation from Kleinfelder, a global engineering firm with a Riverside office, for the Urban Search and Rescue Program.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

That the City Council:

- 1. Approve the acceptance of a \$320 cash donation from Kleinfelder in Riverside, for the Urban Search and Rescue Program; and
- 2. Approve a supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$320 to Miscellaneous Fire Receipts account No. 0000101-341220 and appropriate \$320 for expenditures to Fire-Operations /Special Departmental Supplies account 3510000-426800.

BACKGROUND:

As part of the inaugural 2015 Citywide 9/11 Day of Service, Kleinfelder, a global engineering firm with a Riverside office, sponsored a fundraiser luncheon to benefit the City of Riverside Fire Department's Urban Search and Rescue Program. Formally known as Urban Search and Rescue California Task Force 6 (US&R TF-6), this elite team of highly specialized personnel and resources performs search and rescue for major disasters at both the State and Federal levels, and was among the first responders deployed to the terrorist attacks at the World Trade Center. If approved by the City Council, the \$320 donation will be used to purchase bottled water and Meals Ready to Eat (MREs) to supplement the US&R TF-6 readiness supplies cache.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The fiscal impact is \$320 and will be which will be used to purchase water and MREs for CA TF-6.
