A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIVERSIDE, CALIFORNIA, (1) DECLARING THAT REPAIRS TO THE RIVERSIDE METROPOLITAN MUSEUM COLLECTIONS STORAGE FACILITY ARE OF URGENT NECESSITY FOR THE PRESERVATION OF LIFE, HEALTH AND PROPERTY; (2) AUTHORIZING THE REPAIR WORK TO BE PERFORMED **BIDDING** COMPETITIVE **PURSUANT** TO **PURCHASING** CITY RESOLUTION NO. 22576 AND **CHARTER SECTION** (3) AWARDING A CONTRACT TO MCMURRAY STERN INC., FOR THE NECESSARY REPAIR WORK; AND (4) AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE THE NECESSARY CONTRACT DOCUMENTS.

WHEREAS, in 2006, the building at 1006 Dalton Road ("Dalton Facility") was purchased for collections storage for the Riverside Metropolitan Museum ("RMM"); and

WHEREAS, the Dalton Facility houses over 100,000 objects which represent the City of Riverside's ("City") history, natural history, anthropology and archives ("City Collection"); and

WHEREAS, while the Dalton Facility provides more appropriate collection storage than the previous location, the Dalton Facility experiences water intrusion even during minor rains; and

WHEREAS, the RMM is the steward of the region's history and preserves this history through objects that represent the City's citrus heritage, Native American baskets, textiles, fine furnishings and the National Historic Landmark Harada House Collection and Archive; and

WHEREAS, on May 13, 2015, during the California Office of Emergency Services Great Floor Drill, City staff learned through GIS modeling, the Dalton Facility is in a 500 year flood plain and downstream from a 100 year flood plain; and

WHEREAS, the Dalton Facility and surrounding area are protected by a levee at the end of the cross street of Dalton Road, the levee was deemed "unacceptable" by an Army Corps of Engineers Inspection in 2001; a rating of "unacceptable" means there are deficiencies in the levee that will impair its functioning during a flood event; and

WHEREAS, due to the lack of storm drains in the immediate area, water rises above the curbs and enters through the staff entrance and roll-up doors; and

WHEREAS, the Dalton Facility is at a low point in the industrial park and rain and runoff seep into the building and require immediate attention to avoid objects getting wet and to prevent mold and mildew from growing in the building and damaging the City Collection; and

WHEREAS, the predicted El Niño rains for winter 2015-2016 require preventative measures to remediate the immediate risks to the City Collection housed at the Dalton Facility; and
