SUBJECT: ACCEPTANCE OF \$25,000 FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE CONTROL – SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION

ISSUE:

Acceptance of grant funds in the amount of \$25,000 from the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control for the ABC-OTS grant program.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

That the City Council:

1. Authorize the acceptance of grant funds in the amount of \$25,000 from the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control;
2. Authorize an increase in revenues in the amount of \$25,000 and appropriate expenditures in the same amount to an account as assigned by the Finance Department for the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control grant; and
3. Authorize the City Manager, or his designee, to execute all grant documents.

BACKGROUND:

In August 2014, the Riverside Police Department submitted a proposal to the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) to conduct Minor Decoy and Shoulder Tap programs in the City of Riverside. The goal of the Minor Decoy program is to reduce the number of ABC licensees who sell alcoholic beverages to minors. The goal of the Shoulder Tap program is to decrease the number of adults who furnish alcoholic beverages to minors. Both of these alcohol enforcement programs will assist in combating problems associated with underage alcohol consumption.

If approved by City Council, the grant funds will be used to pay overtime to conduct these operations during the grant period of October 1, 2015 through September 30, 2016.

FISCAL IMPACT:

There is no impact to the General Fund. The total grant award is \$25,000. No matching funds are required.
