2. These are shared by all divisions in the Department to carry out specific missions based upon different circumstances.

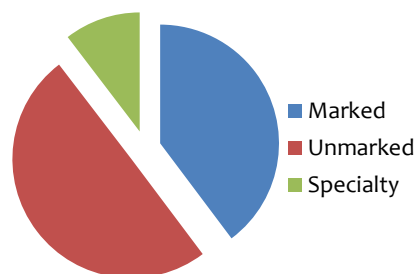

Total Vehicles

- **345 Total Vehicles**



- 124, or 36%, are marked vehicles
- 195, or 56%, are unmarked vehicles
- 26, or 8%, are specialty vehicles

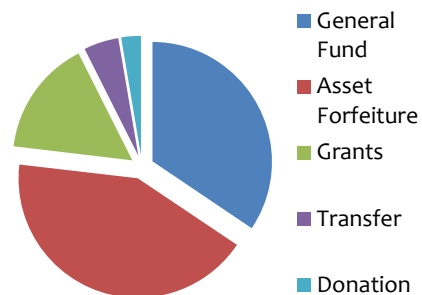

Funding Source for Vehicles

- **345 Total Vehicles**



- 159, or 46%, funded with by general fund
- 105, or 31%, funded by asset forfeiture
- 59, or 17%, funded by grants
- 10, or 3%, funded by City transfer
- 12, or 3%, funded by donation

Average Age of Vehicles

1. Marked cars is 4.57 years
2. Unmarked cars is 7.07 years
3. Motorcycles is 4.63 years
4. Specialty vehicles is 16.23 years

Painting Unmarked Vehicles to Marked "Black and White"

- Not a crime deterrent.
 - Most police scholars agree that "random patrols" do not reduce crime, prevent crime, or reduce the fear of crime.
 - Detectives driving converted black and white vehicles would be considered "random patrols".
- Not a best practices approach to fighting crime.
- Not utilized by other law enforcement agencies.

195 unmarked vehicles @ \$13,575 ea.

1. Paint/emblems;
2. emergency lights/siren;
3. radio/electronics;
4. COBAN video system

Public Safety Issues

1. Converting unmarked cars to marked cars reduces officer and citizen safety.
 - a. Unmarked cars were purchased for use by non-uniform personnel, hence, they are not pursuit rated.
 - b. Unmarked cars do not have the engine, suspension, tires, or braking upgrades which are factory installed on pursuit rated cars.
 - c. For example, apart from brake fade and failure issues due to a lesser grade of equipment, the baseline braking distance at 60 MPH is 175 feet in an unmarked Ford Fusion, as opposed to 139 feet in a police interceptor sedan.

Public Safety Issues

2. Because unmarked cars are not equipped with the proper upgrades, they have been deemed unsuitable for vehicle pursuits.
3. Converting unmarked cars into first responder cars would impart an expectation that they be used to conduct enforcement stops, respond "Code -3" (lights & sirens) to emergencies, and pursue fleeing suspects. Doing so in these vehicles would increase risk of harm to police employees and the public.
