# City Council Memorandum

**SUBJECT: REMOVAL OF 2-HOUR PARKING ZONE ON BROCKTON AVENUE – RESOLUTION**

## **ISSUES:**

The issue for City Council consideration is removal of the existing 2-Hour Parking Zone on both sides of Brockton Avenue from Mission Inn Avenue (noted on the original Master Parking Schedule Resolution as Seventh Street) to University Avenue.

## **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

That the City Council adopt a resolution to remove the “2-Hour Parking between the hours of 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. of any day except Sunday and holidays” Zone on both sides of Brockton Avenue from Mission Inn Avenue (formerly Seventh Street) to University Avenue.

## **BOARD RECOMMENDATIONS:**

On April 6, 2016, the Transportation Board (Board) reviewed this matter; seven of nine members were present. The Board voted six to one in favor of the proposal to remove the 2-Hour Parking Zone on both sides of Brockton Avenue from Mission Inn Avenue to University Avenue.

## **BACKGROUND:**

The Public Works Department received a petition from 100% of the properties on Brockton Avenue between Mission Inn and University Avenues to remove the existing 2-Hour Parking Zone to provide additional on-street parking opportunities for business patrons, employees and residents. The existing restrictions were enacted years ago to promote turn-over of parking spaces for area businesses. Area parking needs have since changed and removal of the existing 2-Hour Parking restriction would provide desired long-term on-street parking for residents and businesses.

Removal of the 2-Hour Parking Zone would better meet the current on-street parking demands for the area.

## **FISCAL IMPACT:**

The cost of sign removal is nominal. Funding is available in the existing Public Works Department budget.
