




# **Turf Removal Funding Timeline**


- August 2014 State Mandated 25% Water Consumption Reduction
- December 2014 RPU Increased Turf Removal Incentives to \$2 and \$3
- December 2014 RPU Increased Turf budget with Internal and MWD Funding
- July 2015 RPU Turf Removal Funding is Exhausted
- September 22, 2015 Council Approves \$1.5M Transfer from Water Fund Balance to Water Conservation & Reclamation
- October/December 2015 RPU Implements New Web-based Rebate Processing Tool to Handle Large Program Participation
- December 2015 RPU Re-opens Turf Removal Programs at a Reduced Incentive Level of \$1
- December 2015/Present Commercial Turf Programs Fully Subscribed. Residential Program Slows
  Drastically from Previous FY
- Present RPU Requests Budget Transfer from Residential WaterWise Back to Water Fund Balance














## **Turf Removal Program**

#### Residential Program's moderate participation may be attributed to:

- Opening program during a non-traditional planting season
- Lack of general media attention for drought and water conservation compared to last fiscal year
- Increased media attention regarding potential higher rainfall during a predicted El Nino event
- The cost of turf removal projects relative to the reduced rebate amount
- "Drought Fatigue"

#### Substantially reduced participation levels in Residential Rebate Program:

Sustain program at current incentive level with Water Conservation
 Surcharge Funding



### **Water Fund Balance**

Implemented Emergency Drought regulations as issued by the Governor and California State Water Resources Board.

- 21% reduction in water use achieved

Water revenues are down by 22% (\$14 million) compared to fiscal year 2013/14 due to drought conditions and conservation efforts.

Unprecedented water revenue loss



### **Recommendations**

#### That the Board of Public Utilities:

1. Authorize a budget transfer of funds in the amount of \$750,000 from the Residential Waterwise Landscape Incentive Account 6220200-457011 to the 520 Water Fund Balance Account 0000520-298000.
