## Community Quality of Life Survey

Purpose: To gather, analyze and share actionable data about opinions of Riversiders regarding their quality of life



**2,234** people participated!



## Survey Methods



- Riverside Community Quality of Life Survey Measured Perceptions
  - → The purpose of the Survey was to gather, analyze and share actionable data about opinions of Riversiders regarding their quality of life
    - ✓ 2013 survey: Set baseline for long-term measurement
    - ✓ Spark community-wide engagement
    - √ 2015 survey: What has changed?







## Survey Methods



➤ What is a "Riversider"?????

#### Four different target populations:

- ✓ City of Riverside adult residents
- ✓ People who work in Riverside but live elsewhere
- ✓ College Students
- ✓ City of Riverside youth residents







## Survey Methods



- PHONE SURVEY Is a Statistically Valid Snapshot of Residents' Perceptions of Quality of Life
  - → Phone survey of **residents**: Sept 10 15, 2015
    - ✓ Randomly selected (includes cell phones)
    - √ 523 City residents
    - ✓ Conducted in **English** (449) and **Spanish** (74)
    - ✓ 95% confidence in results, +/- 4.3%
    - ✓ Accuracy for sub-groups is lower
  - → In report and documents, phone survey results are in BOLD

## Survey Methods



- Online survey was hosted at RiversideSurvey.com.
  - → Online surveys October 1 through 31, 2015
    - √ 1,483 adult residents
    - ✓ 12 youth residents (those under 18)
    - √ 216 people who work in Riverside but live elsewhere

In report and documents, <u>online</u> results are <u>UNDERLINED</u>

## Survey Methods




In summary:

We have a rich data set to "mine" (2,234)

- 523 phone survey
- 1,483 online surveys from adult residents
- 216 enline surveys for those who work in Riverside but live elsewhere
- 12 <u>online</u> surveys from youth (unfortunately not enough to analyze)

# Analyzing the Data: Riversiders Feel Positive About...



## Riverside as a Good Place to Raise a Family and Prosper

- → 90.2% strongly agree or agree that Riverside is "a good place to raise children"
- → **85.5%** (up from **80.5%**) feel that "Riverside is a place where I can realize my goals for the future"





#### A few final positive comments



- "I like it here. Wonderful place."
- \* "Good place to live."
- "It has improved and is a good place to live."
- "I like it here, but wish it would be safer."
- "Glad they are doing this survey and that they are listening to the voice of the community."

## Analyzing the Data:

Riversiders Feel "Relatively Positive" About...



#### Vibrant Arts & Culture Opportunities

→ 85.3% strongly agreed or agreed that "Riverside is a good place to enjoy art and culture"

#### **BUT**

Only 63.1% say "Festivals and special events" meet their needs; 56.8% say "Concerts and live theater" meet their needs; 41.5% say that Riverside's "Places to hear music and dance" meet their needs

# Improving Environment for Riverside Businesses

- → 83.7% (up from 75.9%) who felt able to respond agreed "Riverside is a good place to own or operate a business or nonprofit organization"
  - → 89.6% of Hispanics agreed
  - → 77.5% of non-Hispanics agreed
- → <u>64.4%</u> believe that Riverside's workforce is properly trained and educated
- → 62.1% (up from 51.7%) think Riverside is a good place to find a job (66.0% of Hispanics vs 55.2% of non-Hispanics)



# Analyzing the Data: Riversiders Feel Less Positive About...



### Neighbors Connected to One Another, But Not Their Neighborhood

Riversiders have supportive neighbors they know, but most respondents *could not name their neighborhood*. Connections among neighbors is about the same as the national average.

- → 47.1% (up from 42.0%) said they know most or all of their neighbors
- → 80.6% have at least one neighbor who would help them if they needed help.
- → 26.2% didn't know what neighborhood they live in, & 7.3% gave a non-existent neighborhood

# Analyzing the Data: Riversiders Most Concerned About...



#### Feeling Safe Overall

Riversiders (79.4%) said they do feel it is safe to walk in their neighborhood

→ Of those who feel somewhat safe or not safe,
 61.8% attributed their feelings to crime and "gang problems," 12.4% said "homeless," 6.3% said poor lighting

**68.0%** said they are not at all or not too fearful they will be victims of a serious crime in Riverside

## Analyzing the Data: Riversiders Most Concerned About...



#### Some quotes from the online survey:

- "Downtown there are panhandlers and unclean sidewalks. I have basic safety concerns when walking alone."
- "Work on the homeless situation. Maybe more shelters and police involvement?"
- "Home invasion and theft in our neighborhoods."
- "There is a place across the street from me that sells drugs...definitely not safe!!"
- "Help us more to make it safer."



## Analyzing the Data: Riversiders Most Concerned About...



## Progress in Addressing Homelessness Insufficient

- → Only 47.3% (down from 50.4%) of residents feel satisfied with the progress made in addressing homelessness in Riverside, despite citywide efforts of the private, public and nonprofit sectors.
- → When asked what people like least about living in Riverside, 8.7% (up from 4.8%) said "homeless." That figure is 23.5% on the online survey.
- → College students commented online on the homeless around University Avenue.
