RESOLUTION NO.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIVERSIDE, CALIFORNIA, RECITING THE FACT OF THE GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION HELD IN SAID CITY ON THE 7th DAY OF JUNE, 2016, DECLARING THE RESULTS THEREOF AND SETTING FORTH SUCH OTHER MATTERS AS ARE PROVIDED BY LAW.

6 WHEREAS, a General Municipal Election was held and conducted in the City of
7 Riverside on the 7th day of June, 2016, as required by law for the purpose of electing a Mayor
8 of the City of Riverside and voting on Measures A and B; and

9 WHEREAS, notice of said election was duly and regularly given in the time, form and 10 manner as provided by law; voting precincts were properly established; election officers were 11 appointed and in all respects said election was held and the returns made and declared in the 12 time, form, and manner as required by the provisions of the Charter of the City of Riverside and 13 the Elections Code of the State of California for the holding of public elections in the City of 14 Riverside; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 22948 adopted on the 12th day of January, 2016, Resolution No. 22967 adopted on the 9th day of February, 2016, and Resolution No. 22979 adopted on the 8th day of March, 2016, the appropriate County official canvassed the returns of said election and has certified the results to this City Council and said results are received, attached, and made a part hereof as Exhibit "A".

20 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Riverside, as 21 follows:

<u>Section 1:</u> That there were eighty-six (86) voting precincts established for the
 purpose of holding said election consisting of the consolidation of the regular election precincts
 in the City of Riverside as established for the holding of state and county elections.

Section 2: That said General Municipal election was held for the purpose of electing
 a Mayor of the City of Riverside and for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the
 City of Riverside the questions as to whether proposed Charter amendments known as Measures
 A and B and more particularly described in Attachment "A" Section 1 of Resolution No. 22966

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and Resolution No. 22978 of the City of Riverside, should be approved. 1

2 Section 3: That the whole number of votes cast in said City election, excepting therefrom vote by mail ballots was _____; that the whole number of vote by mail ballots cast in 3 said City election was _____; and that the total of all votes cast in said City election was _____. 4

Section 4: That the names of the persons voted for at said election and the office 5 which each person was voted for are as follows: 6

11	Section 8: That the City Clerk shall enter on the records of the City Council of said	
12	City a statement of the results of the General Municipal election held on June 7, 2016, showing:	
13	(1) The whole number of votes cast in the City;	
14	(2) The names of the persons voted for;	
15	(3) The office each person was voted for;	
16	(4) The number of votes given at each precinct to each of said persons;	
17	(5) The number of votes given in the City to each of said persons;	
18	(6) The Measures voted on; and	
19	(7) The number of votes given in the City for and against each of said Measures.
