



## **EASEMENT DEFINITIONS**

- 1. PUBLIC UTILITY EASEMENT
  - ELECTRIC AND COMMUNICATION EASEMENT IN, UNDER, UPON, OVER, AND ALONG PROPERTY
- 2. PUBLIC UTILITIES EASEMENT OVERHEAD
  - ELECTRIC AND COMMUNICATION EASEMENT OVER PROPERTY
- 3. TEMPORARY CONSTRUCTION EASEMENT
  - CONSTRUCTION EASEMENT GOOD FOR 60 DAYS FROM NOTICE TO PROCEED TO ENTER PROPERTY

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## **REAL PROPERTY INTERESTS**

- 1. 100 TOTAL ACQUISITIONS NEEDED
- 2. 60 ACQUISITIONS ACQUIRED
- 3. 40 ACQUISITIONS OUTSTANDING
- 4. OWNED BY 36 PROPERTY OWNERS
- 5. 36 RESOLUTIONS OF NECESSITY,
- ONE REQUIRED FOR EACH PROPERTY OWNER







## THE RESOLUTIONS OF NECESSITY REQUIRE THE CITY COUNCIL TO ADOPT AND MAKE FOUR (4) FINDINGS. THE REQUIRED FINDINGS ARE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. Whether the public interest and necessity require the proposed project.
- 2. Whether the proposed public project is planned and located in a manner that would be most compatible with the greatest public good and the least private injury.

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### CONTINUED – RESOLUTIONS OF NECESSITY

- 3. WHETHER THE PROPERTY INTERESTS SOUGHT TO BE ACQUIRED IS NECESSARY FOR THE PROPOSED PROJECT.
- 4. WHETHER THE OFFER REQUIRED BY SECTION 7267.2 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE HAS BEEN MADE TO EACH OF THE OWNERS OF RECORD.

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## **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

That the Board of Public Utilities:

- Recommend that the City Council consider adoption of thirty-six (36) Resolutions of Necessity authorizing the initiation of eminent domain proceedings to acquire the necessary real property interests to construct the sub-transmission lines connecting the Riverside Energy Resource Center to Harvey Lynn and Freeman Substations as part of the Riverside Transmission Reliability Project; and
- Approve and recommend the City Council approve the expenditure of \$957,800 for deposit into the State Condemnation Fund as part of the eminent domain process based on City of Riverside approved independent appraisals.
