Chairperson Manning and Members of the Planning Commission:

The Downtown Business Council Board of Directors of the Greater Riverside Chambers of Commerce has met with Corman-Leigh Companies on the storage center development project located at Vine and Third Street. The Board will like to convey its support of the Packinghouse Storage Center by Corman-Leigh Companies, entrusting this would create a positive impact on the local economy of Riverside.

The proposed architecture will complement the historical mission style of Riverside, while maintaining the similar packinghouse building formation in the surrounding neighborhood of Eastside. This development will help create a more appealing entrance on Third Street to Downtown Riverside, while preserving the historic district of Eastside.

The development is planned to be a multi-level storage center, classifying it as an urban self-storage building, which will accommodate less space.
