

Ambulance Franchise Fees for American Medical Response

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
BACKGROUND

- 1. The current contract for Basic Life Support and Advanced Life Support transport services was negotiated by the fire department and adopted by City Council on October 5, 2010.
- 2. On June 19, 2012, the Fire Department recommended and the City Council approved the first amendment and extension for the contract for a period of three years.
- 3. On June 23, 2015, the Fire Department recommended and the City Council approved a second amendment and extension for a period of three years.

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Franchise Fees

- 1. In December 2014 the City of Riverside granted the first of four ambulance companies a non-emergency ambulance franchise.
- 2. In December 2014 a franchise fee of \$1200.00 per ambulance per year was established for non-emergency ambulance franchisees.
- 3. The franchisee fee was established to recoup associated costs to the City for overseeing non-emergency ambulance franchisees.

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Franchise Fees & AMR

- 1. At the time the new fee was implemented, AMR was under an existing contract to provide both 9-1-1 and non-emergency transports, and not subject to the new fee.
- 2. When the existing AMR contract expires in 2018, the new contract will separate emergency and non-emergency medical services for consistency with other non-emergency transport providers.
