EMINENT DOMAIN - RIVERSIDE TRANSMISSION RELIABILITY HIGH VOLTAGE LINES - RESOLUTIONS Hearing was called to consider adoption of 32 Resolutions of Necessity authorizing initiation of eminent domain proceedings to acquire the necessary real property interests for the proposed Riverside Transmission Reliability Project and approve the minimum expenditure of \$919,500 for deposit into the State Condemnation Fund for condemnation of certain real property interests necessary for the Riverside Transmission Reliability Project.
