

Left Wall Elevations











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

Follow your child's lead, and join in **their** play.
Play is how children learn!

write

Model writing!
All art activities for young children are precursors to writing!

read

Read every day.

Ask librarians for age and interest appropriate books!

talk

Narrate your child's life. Add one more word when you echo your child. Use big and rare words!

sing

Sing every day, even off key! Singing helps break down words into smaller parts.

talk!

Narrate your child's day!
Parents who spend more time
talking and interacting with babies
and toddlers have children with up
to five times larger vocabulary
than parents who talked less!
Of course!

congruence

Try to talk about what your baby is watching and noticing!

avoid

"No! Sit Still! Listen!" while reading....why?

Children associate harsh language and negative interactions with BOOKS and READING!

Match reading time to your child's mood, interest, and attention span.

Children who enjoy reading time will read more!

play!

Play is the work of childhood. Play is simply how children learn!

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E: Graphics (Rare Words)

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what is a 'rare word?'

About 10,000 words are commonly used in conversation, but some kindergartners start school knowing over 20,000 words, including 10,000 common words and 10,000 'rare words!'

Picture books have three times as many 'rare words' as most everyday speech.

Read to your child every day!
