CASE P16-0161 - APPEAL - CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT - PUBLIC CHARTER SCHOOL - 5188 ARLINGTON - PUBLIC SCHEDULED

Hearing was called to consider an appeal by Kyle Knowland of Alta Vista Public Charter School to overrule the Riverside County Airport Land Use Commission findings of inconsistency with the Riverside County Airport Land Use Compatibility Plan for a conditional use permit for a public charter school within a 10,250-square-foot tenant space in an existing multi-tenant commercial shopping center located at 5188 Arlington Avenue. people spoke on the matter. The public hearing was officially closed. Following discussion, the City Council (1) expressed its intent, by a 2/3 vote, to adopt the findings contained in the written staff report and within the resolution overruling the Riverside County Airport Land Use Commission findings of inconsistency with the Riverside County Airport Land Use Compatibility Plan; and (2) scheduled a second public hearing for January 10, 2017, at 3 p.m. for consideration of a conditional use permit (Case P16-0161) for a public charter school and Riverside County Airport Land Use Commission override.

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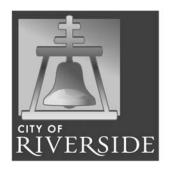

The City Council (1) accepted the resignations of Chloe R. Arias from the Human Relations Commission and Darrell L. Ament from the Board of Public Utilities, effectively immediately, and requested the City Clerk to process the vacancies; and (2) appointed Nicholas R. Chitwood to the Citywide seat on the Human Relations Commission for a term ending March 1. 2020.

CASE P14-0246 - ANNEXATION 118 - CENTRAL/SYCAMORE CANYON - ORDINANCE ADOPTED

The City Council adopted an ordinance amending Section 1.12.020 of the Riverside Municipal Code by adding to the Second Ward the territory known as Annexation 118 - Central/Sycamore Canyon, located northerly of Central Avenue and southwesterly of State Route 60, Interstate 215 Freeway; whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived, Ordinance No. 7355 of the City of Riverside, California, Amending Section 1.12.020 of the Riverside Municipal Code by Adding to the Second Ward the Territory Designated as "LAFCO No. 2015-08-1 Reorganization to Include Annexation No. 118 to the City of Riverside and Concurrent Annexation to Northwest Mosquito and Vector Control District and Concurrent Detachments from County Service Area 93 and the Riverside County Waste Resources Management District" as of the Effective Date of Such Annexation to the City of Riverside, was presented and adopted.

PURCHASE AND DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT - CITY-OWNED VACANT LAND - 3909-3917 VAN BUREN

The City Council (1) approved a Purchase and Development Agreement with Dr. Mohammed A. Hassan for \$150,000 for the disposition of surplus City-owned vacant land for a medical office development project located at 3909-3917 Van Buren Boulevard, identified as Assessor's Parcel Numbers 191-311-037 and 038; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the Agreement, including making minor, non-substantive changes, and to sign all documents and instruments necessary to complete the transaction and to expend up to \$5,000 out of sales proceeds for title, escrow and related closing costs.

PURCHASE AND SALE AGREEMENT - MULTI-TENANT COMMERCIAL BUILDING - 3615-3653 MAIN AND 3700 SIXTH

The City Council (1) approved a Purchase and Sale Agreement with D.R.R. Properties, Inc., Newport Beach, in the amount of \$3,250,000 for sale of a City-owned multi-tenant commercial building located at 3615-3653 Main and 3700 Sixth Streets, identified as Assessor Parcel Number 213-222-007; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the Agreement, including making minor, non-substantive changes, and to sign all documents and instruments necessary to complete the transaction and to expend up to \$10,000 for title, escrow and miscellaneous related closing costs.

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DOWNTOWN PARKING AND BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT AREA ANNUAL ASSESSMENT - PUBLIC HEARING SCHEDULED - RESOLUTION

The City Council (1) approved the annual report of the Downtown Parking and Business Improvement Area; (2) adopted a Resolution of Intention to impose the annual assessments for Calendar Year 2017; and (3) scheduled a public hearing for November 15, 2016, at 3 p.m., for the purpose of adopting a resolution imposing the 2017 assessments; whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived, Resolution No. 23106 of the City Council of the City of Riverside, California, Declaring Its Intention to Levy an Annual Assessment in the Downtown Parking and Business Improvement Area for Calendar Year 2017 Pursuant to Section 36534 of the California Streets and Highways Code, Generally Describing the Improvements and Activities to be Undertaken and Fixing the Time and Place for a Public Hearing Before the City Council of the City of Riverside on the Levy of the Proposed Assessment, was presented and adopted.

REVISIONS TO MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING - RIVERSIDE POLICE OFFICERS' ASSOCIATION SUPERVISORY UNIT - RESOLUTION The City Council (1) approved the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Riverside Police Officers' Association Supervisory Unit effective December 2, 2016, through December 31, 2021, incorporating the negotiated revisions; (2) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the Memorandum of Understanding on behalf of the City; and (3) adopted a resolution amending the Master Fringe Benefits and Salary Plan to reflect the revised MOU provisions as outlined in the written staff report; whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived, Resolution No. 23107 of the City Council of the City of Riverside, California, Amending Resolution No. 21052 to Amend Parts I, II, III and IV of the Fringe Benefits and Salary Plan, to Reflect Various Updates and Changes, was presented and adopted.

SOLICITING - RIVERSIDE MUNICIPAL CODE AMENDMENT ORDINANCE INTRODUCED

The City Council introduced an ordinance to amend the Riverside Municipal Code, Chapter 5.08, Business Taxes, Licenses and Regulations - Soliciting, and Chapter 13.20, Streets and Sidewalks - Pedestrian Mall, to prohibit solicitation for money, donations, products, or services on the Pedestrian Mall; whereupon, an ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance of the City of Riverside, California, Amending Chapters 5.08 and 13.20 of the Riverside Municipal Code to Prohibit Solicitation on the Pedestrian Mall at Main Street, Riverside," was presented and introduced.

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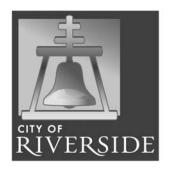

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BID 7430 - INSTALLATION OF WOOD PLAYGROUND CHIPS AT VARIOUS CITY PARKS

The City Council (1) awarded Bid 7430 to Turboscape, Inc., Lake Elsinore, in the amount of \$110,400 from the Park Refurbishing Program Account for delivery and pneumatic installation of certified and engineered wood playground chips at various City parks; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the agreement, including making minor and non-substantive changes.

DONATIONS - POLICE SERVICE DOG, TRAINING, AND EQUIPMENT - SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION

The City Council (1) authorized allocation of \$16,500 from Canine Trust Account 0000720-225140 to Miscellaneous Police Revenue Account 0000101-341190; and (2) authorized a supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$16,500 to Police Capital Project Account 3195000-462200 for the purchase of a police service dog, the required training, and equipment (fencing and crate).

SURPLUS DECLARATION - PURCHASE AND SALE AGREEMENT - RIVERSIDE WATER COMPANY CANAL PROPERTY - THIRD AND COMMERCE

The City Council (1) approved the surplus property declaration for the sale of a 1,576-square-foot portion of the Riverside Water Company Canal property adjacent to the existing canal; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the Purchase and Sale Agreement with 3rd Avenue Storage, LLC, for the sale price of \$8,000, including making minor, non-substantive changes, and to sign all documents and instruments necessary to complete the transaction.

AGREEMENT - REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL NO. 1575 - FOURTEENTH STREET UNDERPASS DRAINAGE STUDY

The City Council (1) approved the Professional Consultant Services Agreement with CWE, Fullerton, in an amount not-to-exceed \$95,604, from the Public Works Department Budget for preparation of a Drainage Study Report for the Fourteenth Street Underpass to identify potential solutions to reduce flooding of the underpass; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the Professional Consultant Services Agreement.

DISCUSSION CALENDAR

RIVERSIDE DOWN PAYMENT ASSISTANCE AND HOUSING REHABILITATION PROGRAM AMENDMENTS
Following discussion, the City Council approved the City Council

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Development Committee recommendations to approve amending the Riverside Down Payment Assistance Program and Housing Rehabilitation Program guidelines to reduce the interest on CalHome deferred loans and on HOME regular and deferred loans from three percent to zero percent.
