RESOLUTION NO. 22288

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIVERSIDE, CALIFORNIA, APPROVING THE APPLICATION FOR A RUBBERIZED PAVEMENT GRANT PROGRAM UNDER TIRE RECYCLING. THE CLEANUP, AND ENFORCEMENT GRANT PROGRAM; AUTHORIZING THE FILING OF SAID APPLICATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT RESOURCES RECYCLING AND RECOVERY (CALRECYCLE); ACCEPTING SAID GRANT; AND AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF THE NECESSARY DOCUMENTS.

WHEREAS, the State of California is faced with the significant challenge of diverting or safely managing more than forty million reusable and waste tires generated each year; and

WHEREAS, millions of waste tires have been illegally dumped or stockpiled throughout the state and pose potential threats to the public health and safety; and

WHEREAS, Public Resources Code sections 40000 et seq. authorize the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle), formerly known as the California Integrated Waste Management Board, to administer various Grant Programs (grants) in furtherance of the state of California's (State) efforts to reduce, recycle and reuse solid waste generated in the State thereby preserving landfill capacity and protecting public health and safety and the environment; and

WHEREAS, in 2002, the Legislature passed Senate Bill 1346, codified in Public Resources Code section 42872.5, expanding the grant program to include awards to governmental agencies for the funding of public works projects utilizing rubberized asphalt concrete; and

WHEREAS, CalRecycle has been delegated the responsibility of administering the grant program within the state, including establishing necessary procedures governing the submission of applications by prospective grantees for Rubberized Pavement (TRP) Grants; and

WHEREAS, said procedures established by CalRecycle require the City Council of the City of Riverside ("City") to certify by resolution the approval of the City to apply for a Rubberized Pavement (TRP) Grant; and

WHEREAS, if awarded a grant, the City will be required to execute an Agreement with the State of California for development of the City's projects; and

WHEREAS, the City presently has paving projects which are eligible under the Rubberized Pavement Grant Program.
