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BACKGROUND

Since 1999

Program Goals:

- 1. Conserve energy (219 kWh/tree)
- 2. Reduce summer cooling costs
- 3. Enhance the City's green spaces

RPU electric customers:

- 1. \$25 per qualified shade tree
- 2. Customers receive up to 6
- 3. 5 trees through regular rebate
- 4. 1 through March back of bill

Launched in 2001

- 2. Increase program participation

RECOMMENDATIONS

That the City Council:

- Authorize the City Manager or his designee, to issue purchase orders to Parkview Nursery, 4377 Chicago Avenue; Parkview Nursery, 3841 Jackson Street; Louie's Nursery, 18550 Van Buren Boulevard and Moon Valley Nurseries, 9501 Lincoln Avenue and make changes to the purchase order amounts based on the variable product demand of each nursery in a collective amount not to exceed \$650,000 for the Tree Power Program's Free Shade Tree Coupon Campaign; and
- 2. Authorize the City Manager or his designee, to credit customer accounts for trees purchased under the Tree Power Rebate Program in a collective amount not to exceed \$100,000.



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
