SUBJECT: RENEWAL OF THE OFFER OF A \$10,000 REWARD AS APPROVED BY COUNCIL ON SEPTEMBER 27, 2016, FOR INFORMATION LEADING TO THE IDENTIFICATION AND APPREHENSION OF PERSON(S) RESPONSIBLE FOR THE DEATH OF DERRICK BUTLER – CONTINUATION OF THE SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION

ISSUE:

Approve a renewal of the offer of a reward in the amount of \$10,000 seeking witnesses to come forward with information related to the murder of Derrick Butler in the City of Riverside, as approved by Council on September 27, 2016.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

That the City Council:

1. Adopt a resolution renewing the offer of a reward in the amount of \$10,000 for information that leads to the identification and apprehension of the person or persons responsible for the death of Derrick Butler, Police Department case #P15-108122, as approved by Council on September 27, 2016, for an additional 90 days; and
2. Approve the continued use of the supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$10,000 from the General Fund Contingency Reserve Account that was allocated on September 27, 2016, and resides in the Police Department's Riverside Reward Program Account No. 3100000-459026.

BACKGROUND:

On July 18, 2015, at approximately 1:52 a.m., Riverside Police Department officers responded to 3527 Main Street in the city and county of Riverside, regarding an adult male victim who had been shot. Upon their arrival, officers located Derrick Butler lying in the street with an apparent gunshot wound to his stomach. Butler was transported to the hospital where he succumbed to his injuries.

A press release was sent out on the morning following the homicide. Although the incident occurred in the crowded entertainment district of Main Street, no eyewitnesses to the shooting

came forward on the night of the shooting, nor have any been identified to date. All the reporting parties just called to report hearing gunshots. Video surveillance video exists, but the camera was partially blocked by umbrellas and a suspect cannot be identified by video alone.

DISCUSSION:

In May of 2001, the “Riverside Reward Program” was approved by the City Council. Guidelines for offering rewards are listed in the Riverside Police Department Policy & Procedures Manual, Policy No. 364.

Detectives believe that offering a significant reward in the amount of \$10,000 may entice one or more witnesses to come forward with information that would help detectives in the identification and apprehension of the person or persons involved in this murder.

On September 27, 2016, City Council adopted a resolution that provided a reward amount of \$10,000 for information that leads to the identification and apprehension of the person or persons responsible for the death of Derrick Butler. The reward offer expired 60 days after the date of Council’s approval.

The attached resolution renews the \$10,000 offer of reward that will expire 90 days after the date of City Council’s approval.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The fiscal impact of the renewal of the reward offer is \$10,000. The amount was previously appropriated from the General Fund Contingency Reserve Account and remains available in the Police Department expenditure Account No. 3100000-459026. If no reward is offered within 90 days of Council’s approval, funds will be returned to the General Fund Contingency Reserve unless once more renewed or extended.
