PLANNING CASE P16-0314 (TTM-37013) — North of Cook Avenue, South of Eddystone Street, and west of Bolton Avenue Proposal by Alex Irshaid of Ramcam Group to consider a Tentative Tract Map (TTM-37013) to subdivide a 12.5 acre vacant parcel into five parcels, for the future development of five single-family residences. Gaby Adame, Assistant Planner, presented the staff report. Alex Irshaid thanked staff for their hard work. Comments from the audience: Scott Andrews spoke in support of the project and the illegal dumping that had previously been happening the property. He also expressed his concern for mitigation of any dirt run-off from the property when it rains be taken care of. Following discussion the Planning Commission recommended that the City Council:  1) Determine that Planning Case P16-0314 will not have a significant effect on the environment based on the findings set forth in the case record and recommend adoption of a Mitigated Negative Declaration and Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program (MMRP); and 2) Approve Planning Case P16-0314 (TTM-37013) based on the findings in the staff report and subject to the recommended conditions.
