#### **EXPEDITED AFTER-HOURS PLAN CHECK**

General Manager of Mission Inn & Hotel Spa submitted for plan check expecting 5 business day turnaround and the City returned in 3 days.

Corrections were submitted the next day and the City approved the same day. It took **only 4 cumulative days** for two rounds of review.





#### **EXPEDITED AFTER-HOURS PLAN CHECK**

In-N-Out **requested a permit in 30 days** and did not think the City was capable of carrying out, so they moved the construction schedule one year out.

The Department convinced In-N-Out Burger to give the City the opportunity to complete within the required timeframe. The City met and exceeded every deadline, the Project Manager from In-N-Out Burger did not think it was possible because they have never seen a city review plans so quickly.



#### NINTH STREET SEWER REPLACEMENT PROJECT

\$2.4 MILLION

INVESTMENT

9,370 LINEAR FEET OF SEWER MAIN LINES

3,130 FEET OF PUBLIC SEWER LATERAL LINES

The project replaced the undersized 6-inch and 10-inch sewer mains on sections of Ninth Street, Park Avenue, Sedgwick Avenue, Twelfth Street, and in the alleys south of Ninth, Tenth, and Eleventh Street with 8-inch and 12-inch sewer pipes. This project also constructed new sewer manholes, replaced 4-inch and 6-inch sewer laterals with similar size PVC sewer services, and installed sewer clean outs.

### **FUEL CELL FACILITY NOW COMPLETE**

The newly constructed fuel cell facility is now 100% operational, converting bio-gas from generated at the Water Quality Control Plant into 1.4 mega watts of power for the Water Quality Control Plant.

Overall electrical rates are at or below market with a first year savings estimated at \$29,000.
