SUBJECT: SELECTION OF 2016 CITY SPIRIT AWARD RECIPIENT

ISSUE:

Select a community member that exemplifies community spirit, good citizenship, and dedication to enhancing the quality of life in the City as recipient of the 2016 City Spirit Award.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

The Mayor's Nominating and Screening Committee recommends that the City Council:

- Select Henry Coil to receive the 2016 City Spirit Award to honor his extraordinary deeds and community spirit, good citizenship, and dedication to enhancing the quality of life in the City; and
- 2. Request the City Clerk to notify Mr. Coil and coordinate with the Mayor's Office to schedule presentation of the award at an upcoming City Council meeting.

On February 14, 2017, the Mayor's Nominating and Screening Committee recommended that the City Council select Henry Coil as recipient of the 2016 City Spirit Award with Mayor Bailey and Members Davis and Gardner voting aye and Member Melendrez voting no.

Henry Coil Jr. is a Civil Engineer and holds a law degree. He joined Tilden Coil Constructors in 1971 and led the company's transition from a home builder to a well-respected commercial, industrial, and institutional design and construction firm. Major local projects include renovation of the Historic Riverside County Courthouse, renovation and repurposing of the old City Hall to their corporate headquarters, construction of the Riverside Community College District Centennial Plaza including the Coil School of the Arts, most of the Memorials at Riverside National Cemetery, and most of the Memorials on the Main Street Mall.

Mr. Coil has been a long time civic leader and philanthropist. He has been a champion of education and youth and contributed significantly to the UCR Culver Center, the Historic Evergreen Cemetery, the Henry W. and Alice Edna Coil School for the Arts, and the Riverside Educational Enrichment Foundation, to name a few.
