INTERAGENCY AGREEMENT WITH WESTERN MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT FOR TEMPORARY SEWER SERVICES - VAN BUREN BOULEVARD - SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION The City Council approved the City Council Development Committee recommendations to (1) approve a conceptual plan to provide new sewer facilities on Van Buren Boulevard between Wood Road and King Avenue; (2) authorize the Public Works Department to begin engineering design, environmental clearance, and right-of-way acquisition for construction of new sewer facilities on Van Buren Boulevard between Wood Road and King Avenue and to collaborate with the County of Riverside Executive Office and Economic Development Agency to create a Community Facility District to fund the Project; (3) approve the Interagency Agreement with Western Municipal Water District to provide temporary sewer services on Van Buren
