# Playground Safety Surfacing

Surfacing types in Riverside's playgrounds

- 1) Poured-in-place rubberized surfacing
- 2) Uniform Wood Fiber (Certified Wood Chips)





- First installation in 1991 at Fairmount Park to replace sand; Product was by Miracle Playground
- 2) Later projects used 5-year warranty product from Surface America





- 1) Current product is manufactured by TotTurf
- 2) 10-year warranty, requires application of top-coat every 18 months
- 3) Replacement cost is about \$17/square foot
- 4) 2015/2016 replacements completed at Arlington, Bordwell, Bryant, Don Derr, Riverwalk, and Sycamore Highlands Parks at a total cost of \$627,466
- 5) Next site Nichols Parks





#### Replacement process

- Remove old surfacing
- 2) Re-compaction of rock base material
- 3) Compaction testing
- 4) Installation of black cushion layer
- 5) Installation of colored wear course
- 6) Head Impact Coefficient (HIC) Testing











- I) As surfacing wears, Parks staff are able to patch and repair small areas
- 2) Large area failure requires removal and replacement





#### **Uniform Wood Fiber**

January and February 2017: 2,335 cubic yards of wood fiber were pneumatically added ("blown-in") at the 13 following park locations:

- Bergamont
- Bobby Bonds
- Castleview
- Collett
- Doty Trust
- Fairmount
- Hunter Hobby
- Patterson
- 1) Contract amount: \$110,400
- 2) About \$47/cubic yard

- Rancho Loma
- Rutland
- Ryan Bonaminio
- Taft
- Thundersky





#### **Uniform Wood Fiber**

- 1) Must meet safety standards for impact attenuation, maneuverability, non-flammability, and sieve test
- 2) Made from 100% clean wood
- 3) Free of twigs, bark, leaf debris
- 4) Free of any foreign objects
- 5) Non-toxic







#### **Uniform Wood Fiber**

- 1) Wood should be raked every 2-3 months
- 2) Wood should be replenished every 1-2 years to maintain a safe play area
