- Planning Division

Title 8: Animals

- Regulates Animal Well-Being
- Public Works

## Code Structure - Definitions

Animal, Domestic

- Small animal
- Typically considered a pet
- Examples: dog, cat, rabbit, songbird, rodent, potbellied pigs
- Excludes: chickens, ducks, geese, hoofed animals, swine


## Animal, Non-Domestic

- Kept in a coop, corral, stable, or pen
- Examples: equine, bovine, porcine, ratite, and any variety of fowl
- Excludes: Domestic Animals

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## Background

- Provide cohesion between Title 19 and Title 8
- Correct discrepancy within Title 19
- Identify appropriate zones for residential and commercial kennels and catteries
- Establish humane conditions for the sale and breeding of animals

Title 19
Kemnahercial Kennel

Any public or private facility where four or more domesticated animals owned by another person are temporarily kept or trained, with or without payment of a fee, trade, barter, commission or remuneration of any sort; provided, however, this definition shall not apply to zoos or to animal hospitals operated by veterinarian duly licensed under the law. (Proposed)

## Title 8

- Commercial Kennel shall have the same meaning as "Kennel" as defined in Chapter 19.910 Definitions, of the Municipal Code.
- Residential Cattery means any building, structure, enclosure or premises located in a residential zone whereupon, or within which, ten (10) or more cats, four (4) months of age or older, are kept or maintained.
- Residential Kennel means any building, structure, enclosure or premises located in a residential zone whereupon, or within which five (5) or more dogs, four (4) months of age or older, are kept or maintained.


## Recommendation 1

## 1. Combine "Boarding of Animals" and "Kennel"

2. Change "Kennel" to "Commercial Kennel"
3. Add "Residential Cattery" and "Residential Kennel"
4. Coordinate with Public Works on max. \# for Catteries and Kennels.
5. Identify appropriate zones for residential and commercial animal keeping and sale uses

## Pet Sales Prohibited Unless

 from:- Animal Shelter
- Humane Society
- Licensed Breeder


## Pet Sales Shop Restrictions:

- Post certificate of source
- Provide certificate of source to purchaser
- Report sales to City

Licensed Breeder

- Located in City
- Breeding Permit (Annual Renewal)
- Background Check
- Application Fee
- Operating Restrictions

Breeder Operating Restrictions:

- 1 litter per year, per animal
- Adequate shelter with outdoor access
- Water and food
- Removal of feces
- Births reported within 10 days
- No offspring sold prior to 8 weeks
- Electronic identification implant


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## Bees - Background

- Urban beekeeping is a rising trend
- Currently only permitted in RR, RA-5, RC and subject to Title 8

Benefits

- Raw honey = more vitamins
- Combat extinction
- Crop pollination

Concerns

- Public safety
- Not enough plant source
- Aggressive hives
- Potential nuisance for adjacent properties


## Title 8 - Setbacks

- $300^{\prime}$ from streets, roads, and freeways
- $500^{\prime}$ from houses/buildings
- 6' height barrier (within 500' of school yards or where people congregate)


## Title 8 - Water Supply

- $100^{\prime}$ from fresh water supply
or
- $300^{\prime}$ from stream/reservoir
- Not within 0.25 miles of water source where people/animals are present (i.e. pool, river, etc.)

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## Bees - Other Cities

| Long Beach | Allowed | Yes | 10 from property lines 6' height barrier | 4 beehives |
| San Diego | Allowed | No | 3 or more beehives 600' from dwelling 100' from any street <br> 2 or fewer beehives within setbacks | No limit |
| Temecula | Allowed | No | 400 ' from dwelling 400' from street 400' from property lines | No limit |
| Orange | Only Agriculture | Yes | 300' from dwelling 100' from property lines | No limit |
| Rancho Cucamonga | Only Agriculture | No | 400' from dwelling 400' from street 400' from property lines | No limit |
| Anaheim | Conditional | CUP | Conditioned | Conditioned |
| Chino | Prohibited | - | - | - |
| Fullerton | Prohibited | - | - | - |
| Pasadena | Prohibited | - | - | - |

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## Recommendations

1. Allow Beekeeping in RE and R-1
2. Restrict Beekeeping in RE and $\mathbf{R - 1}$ in accordance with Title 8.20

- Same as RR, RA-5 and RC

## Hobby/Sport

Pigeons only mentioned in 19.100

- Prohibited in R-3 and R-4

Zoning Interpretations

- Due to Code Enforcement (2002 \& 2015)
- Pigeons = Non-Domestic
- Non-Domestic = Only allowed in RR, RA-5 and RC

| San Diego | Allowed | No | Not specified | 100 pigeons |
| Anaheim | CUP | CUP | Conditioned | Conditioned |
| Temecula | Only Agriculture | No | Not specified | $\begin{aligned} & \frac{1 \text { acre or greater }}{50 \text { per acre }} \\ & \frac{\text { less than } 1 \text { acre }}{24 \text { per parcel }} \end{aligned}$ |

- Rabbits = Domestic in Definitions
- Rabbits = Non-Domestic in Animal Keeping regulations
- Prohibited in for R-3 and R-4
