


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BACKGROUND

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WESTERN'S GOALS

- 1. Secure a lower-cost local supply
- 2. Reduce dependence on imported water
- 3. Increase water reliability for the region





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RIVERSIDE'S GOALS

- 1. Keep rates low
- 2. Monetize water system assets and rights
- 3. Use spare capacities in water system
- 4. Fully utilize established water rights



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WATER MANAGEMENT POLICY PRINCIPLES

- 1. Approved 2014
- 2. Riverside will strive to appropriately monetize unused and potentially expiring local water production and export rights through pre-planned and pre-executed water sales agreements

- 1. 2009 Production and Conveyance Agreement
 - a. Move Western Water
- 2. 2015 First Amendment
 - a. Lease Riverside Water
- 3. 2016 Second Amendment
 - a. Extend 2015 Amendment



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




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PRODUCTION AND CONVEYANCE

- 1. San Bernardino
- 2. Transmission System
- 3. Two deliveries





TWO-PART AGREEMENT

- 1. Western's water (Wheeling)
 - a. Western secured supplies
 - b. 5,400 AFY
 - c. 20-years
- 2. Riverside water (Sales)
 - a. Surplus water
 - b. 2,000 AFY
 - <u>c</u>. 10-years

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PRICING COMPONENTS

- 1. Capital Recovery
 - a. Physical system
- 2. Energy
 - a. Lift water
- 3. Operations and Maintenance (O&M)
 - a. Service system
- 4. Commodity Charge
 - a. Shared savings vs MWD



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
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PRICING

- 1. Move Western water (Wheeling)
 - a. Capital Recovery + Energy + O&M
- 2. Riverside sales
 - a. (Same as above) + Commodity

ECONOMIC BENEFIT - WESTERN WATER

- 1. 20-year term
 - a. 5,400 acre-ft annually
- 2. RPU Revenue \$83M
- 3. Western Savings \$42M



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ECONOMIC BENEFIT - RIVERSIDE WATER

- 1. 10-year term
 - a. 2,000 acre-ft annually
- 2. RPU Revenue \$17M
- 3. Western Savings \$4.6M



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AGREEMENT POINTS

- 1. Operating Committee
- 2. Exit ramps
- 3. Incentives
- 4. Flexibility with changing conditions



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Regional Water Partnership

- 1. Additional revenue for RPU
- 2. Cost-savings for Western
- 3. Greater water reliability for region
- 4. Greater value for RPU and Western customers



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RECOMMENDATIONS

That the City Council:

- Approve the Cooperative Agreement for long-term Wheeling and Surplus Water sales with Western Municipal Water District of Riverside County; and
- 2. Authorize the City Manager or designee to execute the agreement.



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
