MUNICIPAL CODE AMENDMENT - CLARIFY NON-CLASSIFIED POSITIONS - ORDINANCE ADOPTED The City Council adopted an ordinance amending Section 2.36.040 of the Riverside Municipal Code-Classified Service to clarify Non-Classified positions of the City Attorney, City Clerk, and the City Manager Offices; whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived, Ordinance No. 7376 of the City of Riverside, California, Amending Section 2.36.040 of the Riverside Municipal Code - Classified Service, was presented and adopted.								
POTENTIAL NEW LOCATIONS OF THE RIVERSIDE SPORT HALL OF FAME WALL The City Council directed the City Manager to designate appropriate staff to explore and identify potential new locations and estimated costs of moving

the Riverside Sport Hall of Fame Wall currently located at Newman Park, 4444 Magnolia Avenue, to a new location more central to the Main Street Mall that is more conducive to public viewing and allows for additional space for plaques for future inductees.							
LEASE AGREEMENT - CESAR CHAVEZ COMMUNITY CENTER - COME BACK KIDS CHARTER SCHOOL - 2060 UNIVERSITY The City Council (1) approved the Lease Agreement by and between the City of Riverside and the Riverside County Office of Education to pay the City \$240 monthly rent for approximately 400 square feet of space at the Cesar Chavez Community Center for the Come Back Kids Charter School located at 2060 University Avenue for a term through June 16, 2017, and allowing up to five additional one-year extensions; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the Lease Agreement and the one-year lease extensions.							
ORANGECREST PONY BASEBALL LEAGUE DONATION - ANDULKA PARK BULLPEN EXPANSION - 5201 CHICAGO The City Council accepted a donation valued at \$10,000, from Orangecrest Pony Baseball League to the Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department for expansion of the bullpen at Andulka Park located at 5201 Chicago Avenue.							
AGREEMENT AMENDMENT - SIPPY WOODHEAD SWIMMING POOL AT BOBBY BONDS PARK - 2060 UNIVERSITY The City Council (1) approved the First Amendment to Amended and Restated Facility Use Agreement Woodhead Swimming Pool with Riverside Aquatics Association for an estimated revenue of \$86,000 for use of Sippy Woodhead Swimming Pool at Bobby Bonds Park located at 2060 University Avenue through September 30, 2021; (2) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the First Amendment to Amended and Restated Facility Use Agreement for Sippy Woodhead Swimming Pool with Riverside Aquatics Association, including making minor and non-substantive changes; and (3) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the remaining five-year extension periods, not-to-exceed 10 years, as previously approved in the January 13, 2012, Amended and Restated Facility Use Amended Agreement Between the City of Riverside and Riverside Aquatics Association Woodhead Swimming Pool.							
LEASE AGREEMENT AMENDMENT - CESAR CHAVEZ COMMUNITY CENTER - 2060 UNIVERSITY The City Council (1) approved the First Amendment to the Lease Agreement							

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with Inland Empire Latino Lawyers, Inc., for \$15,889.92 in revenue for 555 square feet of office space at Cesar Chavez Community Center located at 2060 University Avenue allowing a three-year extension term through September 17, 2020; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute necessary documents for the First Amendment to the Lease Agreement.								
AGREEMENT - "WALK WITH EASE" FITNESS PROGRAM - LA SIERRA PARK - SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION The City Council (1) accepted the California Department of Health, Arthritis and Partnership Program \$2,000 grant through the National Recreation and Parks Association to be used to establish a "Walk with Ease" fitness program for seniors at La Sierra Park located at 5215 La Sierra Avenue; (2) authorized a supplemental appropriation of revenue in the amount of \$2,000 to be offset by expenditures in the same amount to an account as established by the Finance Department for the "Walk with Ease" fitness program for seniors at La Sierra Park; and (3) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the grant agreement with the California Arthritis and Partnership Program, a branch of the California Department of Health.
