

1 RESOLUTION NO.

2 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIVERSIDE,
3 CALIFORNIA, (1) DECLARING THAT THE PAVEMENT REPAIRS FOR THE
4 12-INCH WATER PIPELINE BREAK AT THE INTERSECTION OF LYON
5 AVENUE AND VICTORIA AVENUE IN THE UNINCORPORATED AREA OF
6 RIVERSIDE COUNTY ARE OF URGENT NECESSITY FOR THE
7 PRESERVATION OF LIFE, HEALTH, AND PROPERTY AND WAIVING THE
8 FORMAL COMPETITIVE PROCUREMENT REQUIREMENTS OF CITY
9 CHARTER SECTION 1109; (2) AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF A
10 EMERGENCY PURCHASE ORDER IN THE AMOUNT OF \$70,697.50 TO ALL
11 AMERICAN ASPHALT FOR THE REPAIRS.

12 WHEREAS, on Friday, March 24, 2017, an existing 12-inch asbestos cement water pipe
13 separated from an existing 12-inch cast iron fitting, causing significant flooding and a sinkhole at the
14 intersection of Lyon Avenue and Victoria Avenue in the unincorporated area of Riverside County;
15 and

16 WHEREAS, the water pipeline break undermined a substantial portion of the roadway and
17 saturated the soil underneath, causing a portion of the road to fail at the intersection of Lyon and
18 Victoria Avenues; and

19 WHEREAS, in addition, the water pipeline break saturated soils underneath a portion of the
20 asphalt pavement along southbound Lyon Avenue, causing the pavement to heave up and crack,
21 making it difficult for local residents to access their driveways; and

22 WHEREAS, City of Riverside crews were dispatched immediately and were able to safely
23 divert traffic, repair the broken pipeline and make temporary asphalt repairs; and

24 WHEREAS, however, the roadway continued to settle over the coming days creating an unsafe
25 driving condition, and crews were dispatched again to remove and stabilize a larger section of asphalt
26 pavement within Victoria Avenue; and

27 WHEREAS, the City was concerned that the pavement would continue to shift and settle from
28 further voids beneath the pavement, potentially causing a traffic hazard and posing a threat to
motorists; and

WHEREAS, the City's Public Works Department paving crews generally assist Riverside
Public Utilities (RPU) in performing permanent pavement patching related to pipeline leak repairs;

2 WHEREAS, the Public Works Department did not have the resources available to quickly
3 make the extensive pavement repairs needed for this water main break; and

4 WHEREAS, due to the emergency nature of this project, on April 4, 2017, the Purchasing
5 Services Manager issued emergency purchase order number 173999 to All American Asphalt in the
6 amount of \$70,697.50 for the repair to the paving, in accordance with Purchasing Resolution No.
7 22576, Sections 201(a) and 300-302. Those sections provide that the Purchasing Services Manager
8 may authorize work and issue emergency purchase orders “to protect the public health, welfare, safety
9 or property;” and

10 WHEREAS, City Charter section 1109 provides that such purchase orders may be let without
11 advertising for bids if such work or supplies or materials shall be deemed by the City Council to be of
12 urgent necessity for the preservation of life, health or property, and shall be authorized by resolution
13 passed by at least five affirmative votes of the City Council and containing a declaration of the facts
14 constituting such urgency.

15 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Riverside,
16 California, as follows:

17 Section 1: The above recitals are incorporated herein by reference.

18 Section 2: On the basis of the foregoing recitals and the staff report accompanying this
19 Resolution, it is hereby found and declared that the pavement repairs for the 12-inch water pipeline
20 break at the intersection of Lyon Avenue and Victoria Avenue in the unincorporated area of Riverside
21 County was of urgent necessity for the preservation of life, health, and property, and waiving the
22 formal competitive procurement requirements of City Charter 1109.

23 Section 3: The City Manager, or his designee, is authorized to execute the appropriate contract
24 documents with All American Asphalt in the amount of \$70,697.50 for the repair to the paving.
