SUBJECT: AWARD BID NO. 7482 TO RACEWAY FORD, INC. OF RIVERSIDE, CALIFORNIA

FOR THE PURCHASE OF EIGHT REPLACEMENT ETHANOL (E85) FUEL FORD F350 VEHICLES FOR THE PUBLIC UTILITIES - WATER FIELD OPERATIONS

**DIVISION IN THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF \$416,982.72** 

#### **ISSUE:**

Award Bid No. 7482 to Raceway Ford, Inc., Riverside, California, for the purchase of eight (8) replacement, ethanol (E85) fuel, Ford F350 vehicles for assignment to the Public Utilities Department, Water Field Operations division in the total amount of \$416,982.72.

#### **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

That the City Council:

- Award Bid No. 7482 to Raceway Ford, Inc., Riverside, California, for the purchase of eight (8) replacement, ethanol (E85) fuel, Ford F350 vehicles, for the Public Utilities Department in the amount of \$416,982.72;
- 2. Authorize the Purchasing Services Manager to issue a Purchase Order upon approval of the bids.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

The Riverside Public Utilities Department (RPU) Water Field Operations Division is responsible for the construction and maintenance of water transmission and distribution systems in the City of Riverside. The Division has a need to replace eight of its aging trucks to support water field operations.

On March 29, 2017, the Purchasing Division of the Finance Department posted Bid No. 7482 for the purchase of eight (8) replacement, ethanol (E85) fuel, Ford F350 vehicles for use by RPU. Three (3) responses were received. The apparent low bidder was deemed non-responsive for not meeting the required specifications and the bid from Raceway Ford, Inc. was deemed the lowest responsive bidder in the amount of \$52,122.84 per vehicle for a total amount of \$416,982.72.

## **DISCUSSION:**

The Fleet Division evaluates vehicle replacement criteria to insure the efficient management and replacement of vehicles. The vehicles proposed for replacement have exceeded their expected service life and require extensive repairs to be made serviceable as outlined in the table below.

The Fleet Division also makes purchasing recommendations to maintain the City's Green Fleet status and to comply with State air quality regulations. In the case of these vehicles, Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) is not available as a factory option. Therefore, Fleet recommends purchasing vehicles fueled by ethanol (E85) fuel.

E85 is a reliable alternative fuel that meets the requirement of South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD) Rule 1191 (clean on-road light- and medium-duty public fleet vehicles), which requires that public fleets acquire alternate-fuel vehicles to reduce pollutant emissions.

City Charter section 1202(b) requires the Board of Public Utilities to approve all expenditures in excess of \$50,000. As with all other City departments, the Fleet Division operates and maintains vehicles for use by RPU. RPU funds its portion of the Fleet Division by paying a monthly fee to the Fleet Division, which is apportioned for usage (gas), maintenance (mileage), and vehicle replacement. The monthly fees are approved by the RPU Board as part of the annual budget. The Fleet Division accumulates funds in the holding account for vehicle replacement. When the life of the vehicle is deemed to have expired, the Fleet Division will purchase replacement vehicles. The Fleet Division has sufficient funds from the budgeted RPU monthly payments to procure these vehicles, except for the \$8,971.57 which represents vehicle upgrades.

The Purchasing Services Manager and Public Utilities Department concur with the recommendation above.
