LHMP BACKGROUND

1. **Hazard Mitigation Planning is required under the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 (DMA 2000)**
 - A. Local Hazard Mitigation Plan (LHMP) helps achieve eligibility for Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) pre-disaster and post-disaster mitigation grant assistance
 - B. Must be updated every 5 years
 - C. City LHMP last approved in 2012
2. **What is a LHMP**
 - A. Identify hazards
 - B. Review past disaster occurrences
 - C. Estimate probability of future occurrences
 - D. Set mitigation goals to reduce or eliminate long-term risk to people and property from natural and other hazards
