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

PLANNING CASE PSP17-0018 — Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Consistency (Citywide) A request by the City of Riverside Finance Department for the review of the City's FY 17/18 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) and determination of consistency with the General Plan 2025. Dave Murray, Senior Planner, presented the staff report. Comments from the audience: Harry Kurani requested additional information regarding the Public Works projects listed on the Capital Improvement Program. Following discussion the Planning Commission recommended that the City Council:  1) Determine that Review of the City of Riverside's FY2017/18 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) (PSP17-0018) is not subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) review pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15061 (b)(3) because the review is not considered a "project", as defined by section 15378 (b)(4), and the determination of consistency by the Planning Commission has no potential to result in a direct or indirect physical change in the environment; and 2) Find that the FY 2017/18 CIP is consistent with the City's General Plan 2025.
