SUBJECT: UPDATED DEVELOPMENT MITIGATION FEES TO SUPPORT CONTINUED

DEVELOPMENT OF PARK FACILITIES TO SERVE RIVERSIDE RESIDENTS

OF ALL AGES

ISSUE:

In light of the robust park facilities enhancement program now underway in the City of Riverside, staff and the Land Use Committee recommend updates to the Local and Regional/Reserve Park Fee Schedule.

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

That the City Council:

- 1. Adopt the attached resolution (Attachment I) to amend Section 3 of Resolution No. 21085 which was superseded by Council Resolutions 21037 and 21308;
- Authorize assessment of park fees as previously adopted by Council Resolutions 21307 (Local Park Fees) and 21308 (Regional Park Fees) on all future projects, including agerestricted senior citizen housing developments.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS:

On August 14, 2008, the Land Use Committee met and unanimously approved staff's recommendation included in this Council Report.

BACKGROUND:

On August 23, 2005, the City Council authorized a 60% reduction in certain City permit and plan check fees and development mitigation fees associated with the construction of age-restricted senior citizen housing developments. Resolution 21085 was adopted on December 6, 2005 to effectuate this reduction. The 60% discount had been offered under the premise that senior citizens do not utilize public facilities in the same manner as the general public. Since that time however, there have been significant capital projects and investments by the City to create and improve new facilities that directly benefit the City's senior population.

In October 2006, the City Council adopted a Strategic the Riverside Renaissance program within

which nearly \$20 million in capital projects were identified specifically to meet the park facility needs of senior citizens and all city residents.

Adoption of the attached Resolution will remove outdated references to Resolution Nos. 17495 and 18991 which have been repealed by subsequent Resolutions Nos. 21307 and 21308 regarding Local Park Fees and Regional/Reserve Park Fees. These subsequent Resolutions were adopted by City Council and took effect as of March 1, 2007, and deleted provisions for the 60% reduction of park fees for age-restricted senior citizen housing developments. No other discounts of City fees authorized by City Council will be affected by this action to clarify and update the Local Park Fees and Regional/Reserve Park Fees.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Repealing the 60% discount for age-restricted senior citizen housing will increase revenue to Local and Regional Park Fees to help finance projects which serve local seniors and all city residents. There is no impact to the General Fund.

WHEREAS, the premises that senior needs for public facilities is not equal to the general public is no longer applicable due to the increase in capital projects to benefit the senior community in the City; and

WHEREAS, an amendment of Resolution No. 21085 will allow for the City to realize the full Local and Regional/Reserve Park Fees for age-restricted senior housing developments.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Riverside, California, as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>: The foregoing recitals are all true and correct and incorporated herein.

Section 2: Section 3 of Resolution No. 21085 is hereby amended by removing the reference to Resolution Nos. 17495 and 18991; and all other sections of the resolution shall remain in full force and effect.
