



## FY 2017/2018 CALIFORNIA SENATE BILL 1 ROAD REPAIR AND ACCOUNTABILITY ACT OF 2017

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### BACKGROUND

1. On April 28, 2017 the California Governor signed Senate Bill 1, known as the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 (SB-1), to address basic road maintenance, rehabilitation and critical safety needs on state highway and local streets networks.
2. SB-1 increases per gallon fuel excise taxes; increases diesel fuel sales taxes and vehicle registration fees; and provides future inflationary tax rate adjustments in future years.

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## BACKGROUND

3. Beginning November 1, 2017, the State Controller will deposit various portions of this new funding into the State's newly created Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA). A percentage of this new RMRA funding will be apportioned by formula to eligible cities and counties.
4. SB-1 emphasizes the importance of accountability and transparency in the delivery of California transportation programs. Therefore, in order to be eligible for RMRA funding, statute requires cities and counties to follow the basic annual program guidelines.

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## SB-1 GUIDELINES

1. Prior to receiving RMRA funds each fiscal year, the City must submit to the Commission a list of proposed projects.
2. The Project List shall be consistent with SB-1 program priorities which include any of the following: Road Maintenance; Safety; Railroad Grade Separations; Complete Streets; or Traffic Control Devices.
3. The list of projects must include a description and the location of each proposed project, a proposed schedule, and the estimated useful life of the improvements.

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## SB-1 GUIDELINES

4. All proposed projects to receive RMRA funding must be included in the City budget and adopted by the City Council at a regular public meeting.
5. A copy of the City Council meeting minutes approving the project list and appropriating the RMRA funds must be included with the submittal to the Commission.
6. For each fiscal year in which RMRA funds are received and expended, the City must submit documentation to the Commission of the amount of funds expended.

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## FY 2017/2018 PROJECT LIST

1. Repave Box Springs Boulevard from Sycamore Canyon Boulevard to River Crest Drive;
2. Repave 4.0 miles of Minor Streets at 7 different locations with new signing and striping;
3. Reconstruct damaged curbs, gutters, sidewalks, driveways, and pedestrian ramps;

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## FY 2017/2018 PROJECT LIST

4. Install a new traffic signal at Mission Inn Avenue and Pine Street;
5. Install a new HAWK signal at Arlington Avenue and Murray Street for the Regional Learning Center; and
6. Pave a dirt alley between Franklin Avenue and Kansas Avenue, and construct a new bus pad near Longfellow Elementary School.
