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WATER HIGHLIGHTS

Jackson Avenue Recycled Water Pipeline Project (Phase I)

- 1. Board approved the project in June 2017 for \$8,609,000.
- 2. Phase 1 construction began Van Buren Blvd. to Don Derr Park.





WATER HIGHLIGHTS

Indiana Ave. and Mary St. Water Distribution Main Replacement Project

- 1. Board approved the project in June 2017 for \$1,284,968.
- 2. Replaces 4-inch cast iron and asbestos cement pipe installed in the 1940's.

ELECTRIC HIGHLIGHTS

- MicroSynchro Phasors-Partnership with Department of Energy & Lawrence Berkeley National Lab.
- 2. Reduces the ability to detect system disturbances and works 400 times faster than SCADA.
- Lessons learned will support the expansion of energy storage options.

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ADVANCE METERING INFRASTRUCTURE

- 1. AMI is an integrated system of smart meters, communications networks, and data management that enables two-way communication between the utility and customers.
- 2. Board approved \$3,000,000 with Utiliworks Consulting, LLC for the infrastructure upgrade.
