- 2. Award the winners with their prizes.


BACKGROUND:

The annual bottled water label art contest is held in conjunction with the "Splash Into Cash" program. The Riverside Public Utilities (RPU) sponsored high school art contest is open to all public and private high school students in the City of Riverside (City). Students design the label for RPU bottled water that is distributed by the City through sponsorships throughout the year. To date, the Utility has expended more than \$351,000 in program costs and has given out over 555,600 bottles of water to City schools. This year's art was also chosen to design the calendar mousepad and annual financial report cover.

Each contest winner receives \$250 cash, copies of their winning label, two cases of water featuring their label, and a sample of their work printed for the mousepad and financial report. Winners also receive a certificate, copies of which are attached to this report. Art teachers receive a \$50 gift certificate from an art supply store.




