<u>SUBJECT</u>: EMPLOYEE RECOGNITION AWARD TO ENERGY DELIVERY FIELD FORCES THAT PROVIDED MUTUAL AID TO CITY OF COLTON PUBLIC UTILITIES AND IMPERIAL IRRIGATION DISTRICT

ISSUE:

DISCUSSION:

Through our membership in Southern California Public Power Authority (SCPPA) and our involvement with the California Utilities Emergency Association (CUEA), Riverside Public Utilities can receive and respond to requests for mutual aid during and after emergency events such as storms or wildfires. We have responded with personnel and equipment twice in recent months. Once was to the City of Colton after a severe thunderstorm caused a system-wide outage and damaged critical infrastructure. Our

Electric Substation crew assisted with the removal and replacement of a 69kV Circuit Breaker which failed due to a lightning strike. The second response was to the Imperial Irrigation District after a windstorm resulted in the toppling of 80 utility poles. Our Electric Powerline crew assisted with the demolition of failed poles, the installation of replacement poles, and re-hanging the powerlines and associated equipment on a critical portion of an IID 92kV transmission line. Both utilities have expressed their gratitude for our response and the high level of professionalism and knowledge our personnel brought to the effort.

There is no fiscal impact associated in recognizing this staff.
