# ALLEY BETWEEN FRANKLIN AND KANSAS AVENUES AND LINDEN AND FIFTH STREETS – CONVERSION TO ONE-WAY TRAVEL

Two residents spoke in support regarding the establishment of the conversion of a one-way travel alley between Franklin and Kansas Avenues and Linden and Fifth Streets. Following discussion motion was made by Chair Moran and seconded by Member Martin recommending that the City Council approve establishment of a conversion of a one-way travel alley between Franklin and Kansas Avenues and Linden and Fifth Streets. Motion carried unanimously.

#### ARLINGTON AVENUE - REMOVAL OF SEGMENT OF NO PARKING ZONE

Following discussion motion was made by Member Brown and seconded by Vice Chair Armas recommending that the City Council approve establishment of removal of a segment of the existing No Parking Any Time Zone on the north side of Arlington Avenue at the frontage of the Concord Place Apartments located at 5657 Arlington Avenue. Motion carried unanimously.

### ANTIOCH AVENUE - ESTABLISHMENT OF TIMED NO PARKING ZONE

Following discussion motion was made by Member Bullock and seconded by Member Sheth recommending that the City Council approve establishment of a timed No Parking zone at the end of the cul-de-sac on Antioch Avenue during scheduled trash pick-up days and times to facilitate efficient trash service. Motion carried with five of six votes in support.

# **REVISION OF 5-TON WEIGHT LIMIT RESTRICTION – WATKINS DRIVE**

Following discussion motion was made by Member Brown and seconded by Member Martin recommending that the City Council approve revision of the boundaries of the adopted 5-ton weight limit restriction on Watkins Drive from "Spruce Street to Central Avenue" to "Spruce Street to the southerly City limits." Motion carried unanimously.

# SPEED LIMIT ZONE ESTABLISHMENTS AND REVISION – CITRUS STREET, CITRUS HEIGHTS DRIVE, AND HARRISON STREET

Following discussion motion was made by Member Bullock and seconded by Member Sheth recommending that the City Council Motion approve 1) establishment of a 35 MPH speed limit zone on Citrus Street from 800' east of lowa Avenue to the easterly City limits; 2) establishment of a 45 MPH speed limit zone on Citrus Heights Drive from Van Buren Boulevard to the westerly City limits; 3) revise the existing 35 MPH speed limit zone on Harrison Street north of Magnolia Avenue to change the northerly zone boundary; and 4) reduce the existing speed limit on Harrison Street from Garfield Street to California Avenue from 35 MPH to 30 MPH. Motion carried unanimously.
