RIVER-BOTTOM CHALLENGES

- 1. Safety Concerns Terrain and encampments
- 2. Lead Time Coordination requires advance planning
- **3. Crossing the Line** Homeless population is mobile, crosses jurisdictional boundaries (city, county, resource agencies, etc.)
- **4. Difficult to Serve** Reaching and serving the homeless population in river-bottom is difficult


