SUBJECT: NORTHWEST MOSQUITO AND VECTOR CONTROL DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES APPOINTMENT

ISSUE:

Reappoint Dr. Gary Bradley to the Board of Trustees of the Northwest Mosquito and Vector Control District.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the City Council reappoint Dr. Gary Bradley to the Board of Trustees of the Northwest Mosquito and Vector Control District for a four-year term through December 31, 2021.

BACKGROUND/LEGISLATIVE HISTORY:

The Northwest Mosquito Abatement District was formed on December 28, 1959, to control mosquitos in the northwest portion of Riverside County. At present, the District provides vector control services over an area of 350 square miles with a population of approximately 900,000. The District serves the cities of Canyon Lake, Corona, Eastvale, Jurupa Valley, Norco, Lake Elsinore, and Riverside, and the unincorporated areas of western Riverside County.

The eight-member Board of Trustees is comprised of one person appointed by the County Board of Supervisors and one person appointed by the City Councils of Canyon Lake, Corona, Eastvale, Jurupa Valley, Norco, Lake Elsinore, and Riverside. The trustees serve a term of two or four years and may be appointed to successive terms.


Dr. Gary Bradley is a Riverside resident of over 44 years and a longtime community leader previously serving on the Riverside County Housing Commission and the Riverside Museum Associates Board. Dr. Bradley taught biology at La Sierra University for over 37 years. Dr. Bradley was first appointed by the Riverside City Council in July of 2003 to complete an unexpired term from a previous board member. The City Council reappointed Dr. Bradley in January 2006, December 2009, and February 2014. Dr. Bradley wishes to continue service.

According to the District Manager, Dr. Bradley is a dedicated and conscientious person and performs his duties very diligently. As an educator and biologist, Dr. Bradley has been a valuable asset to the District.

FISCAL IMPACT:

There is no fiscal impact associated with the proposed reappointment.
