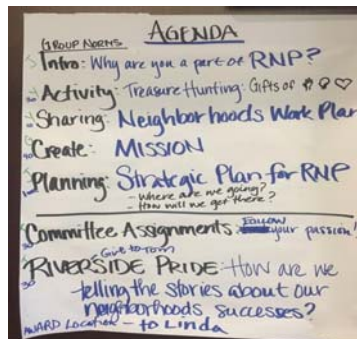

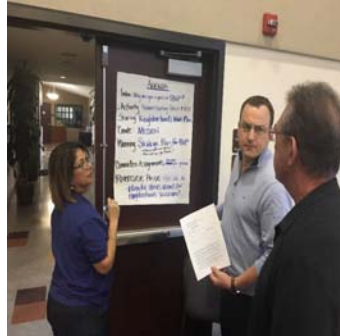
Working Together, Neighbor to Neighbor

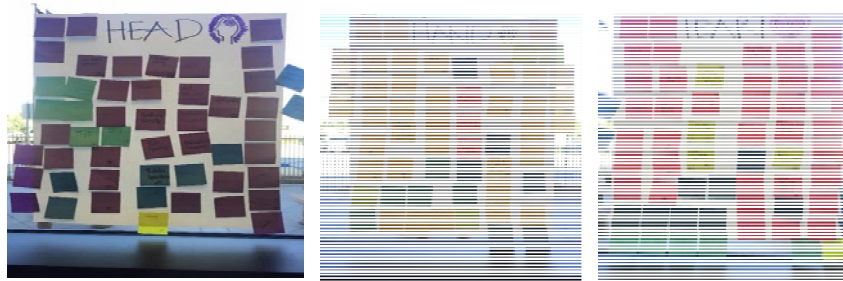
