BACKGROUND


- 1. The MSRC was established by the California Legislature in 1990;
- 2. Sole mission is to invest funds to reduce air pollution generated by mobile sources (i.e., cars, trucks, buses, etc.);
 - a) Funds generated by surcharge on motor vehicle registrations.
- 3. The MSRC works closely with the South Coast Air Quality Management District (AQMD); however, the MSRC is NOT a regulatory agency;
 - a) The MSRC invests in clean air projects that support South Coast AQMD objectives & priorities.

BACKGROUND



- 1. SIGNIFICANT AIR QUALITY CHALLENGES IN OUR REGION;
- 2. ACCORDING TO THE SOUTH COAST AQMD:
 - a) South Coast Region is EXTREME NON-ATTAINMENT for OZONE
 - b) Ozone Causes RESPIRATORY AILMENTS and is a Primary Component of **SMOG**

- 1. NOx is a Precursor to Ozone (SMOG) Formation...
- 2. From Today's Levels NOx Emissions Need to be Reduced 45% by 2023 That's Only a Few Years Away...

BACKGROUND

- 5. Authorize the City Manager, or his designee, to submit all necessary documentation to receive reimbursement under the terms of the MSRC Program Opportunity Notice 2018-01 and to execute all of the grant documents.
