## **Presiding Officer**

The Chair of the Hearing Panel of the Board of Ethics presides over the hearing.

## Roles

As the presiding officer over a Code of Ethics complaint hearing, the Chair has a dual role:

- 1. Meeting Chair; and
- 2. Quasi-judicial judge







A quasi-judicial body is a non-judicial body which can interpret law. It is an entity which has powers and procedures resembling those of a court of law and which is obliged to objectively determine facts and draw conclusions from those facts so as to provide a basis for an official action. Quasi-judicial bodies need not follow strict judicial rules of evidence and procedure.





## **Quasi-Judicial Judge**

Although not a judicial officer, a quasi-judicial judge may exercise many of the functions of a judge. For example, a quasi-judicial judge may rule on procedural requests, motions, or similar matters; rule on objections made by the parties; rule on whether particular evidence is to be admitted or excluded, including witness testimony; and facilitate discussions and deliberations of the Hearing Panel.
