CASE P18-0058 - RIVERSIDE PUBLIC LIBRARY MAIN BRANCH - CITY LANDMARK - 3581 MISSION INN AVENUE - RESOLUTION Hearing was called for Planning Case P18-0058 to designate the Riverside Public Library Main Branch as a City Landmark located at 3581 Mission Inn Avenue, Assessor's Parcel Numbers 213-232-004 and 005. Three people spoke on the matter. The public hearing was officially closed. Following discussion, the City Council (1) determined Planning Case P18-0058 City Landmark Designation is categorically exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Sections 15061(b)(3) and 15308 of the CEQA Guidelines, as it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity will have a significant effect on the environment, said action is intended to preserve the historic character of the building and site, and to provide notice of the historic status; (2) approved Planning Case P18-0058 based on and subject to the Cultural Heritage Board facts for findings outlined in the written staff report; and (3) adopted a resolution designating the Riverside Public Library Main Branch located at 3581 Mission Inn Avenue as a City Landmark; whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived, Resolution No. 23290 of the City Council of the City of Riverside, California, Approving the Application Under Planning Case Number P18-0058 Designating the Riverside Public Library Main Branch Located at 3581 Mission Inn Avenue, Assessor's Parcel Numbers 213-232-004 and 213-232-005, as a City Historic Landmark, was presented and adopted.
